Our Chief Guest, Prof. Kiran Walia, Hon'ble Minister of Social Welfare, Women and Child Development and Languages; Guests of Honour, Prof. J.M. Khurana, Dean ,Student's Welfare and Ms. Anuradha Dutt, eminent lawyer, High Court and Supreme Court of India; distinguished guests, colleagues and young friends.

I extend a warm welcome to all gathered here on the occasion of our College Annual Day. We are honored to have with us Prof. Kiran Walia, Hon'ble Minister of Social Welfare, Women and Child Development and Languages. Prof. Kiran Walia was born in a prominent family of freedom fighters. Her father was closely associated with veteran Sh. Bhagat Singh and worked tirelessly for the Nation. Her family members, in the patronage of the Congress, have served the pubic and country. She started her professional career as a teacher in Lakshmi Bai College of Delhi. During this period she was the first woman who won with record votes in Delhi University Teacher's Association (DUTA) and represented the Teachers' Association in the Executive and Academic Councils for several years. Thereafter she headed the Teachers' cell at the All India Congress Committee for three years and was Chairperson of South Delhi District Development Committee. She was Chairperson of Delhi commission for women. She is now minister of Social Welfare, Women and Child Development and Languages.

She represented India at an International Conference in the USSR. As a member delegate, she visited Malaysia and Melbourne for the Commonwealth Games. She also visited Cambodia and Thailand for the eradication of AIDS. She has presented several Research Papers at many Universities in the country and abroad.

We also have with us Prof. J.M. Khurana Chairperson Sports Council and Dean Students' Welfare. Prof. Khurana has published over 80 papers in different journals. He has supervised more than 20 Ph.d students and an equal number of M.Phil students. He was International Fellow at the Stanford Research Institute from January 1995 to October 1997. He was research Associate, Department of Chemistry, Lehigh University, USA from July 1985 - November 1985. He was Research Associate Department of Chemistry, Marquette University, Milwaukee, USA. He was also Post Doctoral Fellow Department of Chemistry University of Alberta, Edmonton, Canada.

Ms. Anuradha Dutt's name deserves mention. She Graduated in Law in 1981 from Delhi University. In 1982 she did in L.L.M from the University of Columbia. She is a renowned cricketer and was the Hony. Secretary of the Delhi Women's Cricket Association from 1991 - 2005. She received the Outstanding Sportsperson Award for the year 1980-1981 from the Law Faculty, Delhi University. She has successfully represented a leading global telecommunication company in a \$2.1 billion tax litigation Supreme Court of India case that resulted in a landmark judgment in the field of tax treatment of International Mergers., and Acquisitions. Ms. Dutt has been involved with several complex corporate, commercial civil and tax litigation cases. Her area of expertise includes corporate restructuring, infrastructure financing, telecommunications, investments and direct and indirect taxes. She functions on the panels of the Public Sector and Union of India.

We are thankful and highly indebted to Ms. Dutt for her help and support during the very troubled period of teachers' struggle for honour and dignity. We wish to express our heartfelt thanks to her for helping us safeguard the honour and integrity of our college.

Lakshmibai College has made Delhi University proud. We aim at the holistic development of our students through awareness generation, better teaching-learning facilities, vocational courses and co-curricular activities. Admission and results

In all 3,472, under graduates students are enrolled in the college. The break up is as follows:-

In addition 16 students are pursuing various courses at the post graduate level. Our M.A results have been impressive; 100 % in M.A (Sanskrit), M.A (Political Science), M.A. (Philosophy) previous year.

The college has done exceptionally well with brilliant results. Final year results are 100 per cent in Hindi (H), B.Sc. Maths (H) and Sanskrit (H);94.87 per cent in B.Com (H) 94.11 per cent in Phil (H) 90.29 per cent in B.Com. There have been 25 First Division in Final Year B.A (Prog.) 50 First Division in Final year B.Com; and 31 First Divisions in Final Year B.Com (H).

Second year results are 100 per cent pass score in B.Sc Maths (H); B.A Economics (H) and B.B.E 98.4 percent in B.com (H); 98.3 percent and B.Com; 98.7 percent in B.A (Prog.) Apart from this, there have been 29 first division in B.A (Prog.) and 66 first division in B.Com. The B.Com (H) students have done us proud by securing as many as 43 First Divisions while B.B.E students have secured 16 First Divisions.

First year results are also commendable. 100 per cent in B.B.E 99.77 per cent in B.A (Prog.); 98.3 percent in B.Com; and 89.53 percent in B.Com (H). There have been 55 First Divisions in B.Com (H) and 9 First Divisions in B.B.E.

The Hindi and Dramatics Society organized four key competitions in the 2011-12 session. On 27 september 2011, a debate on Democracy is the Best was organized. The next event of note was a poetry writing competition. Students presented original and impressive poems on contemporary issues. This was followed by an essay-writing competition on topics like Women's Empowerment, Lokpal Bill, Traffic congestion in Delhi, Corruption, Relevance of Gandhiji, State an Direction of Hindi Literature.

A story-writing competition was organized to encourage students to develop creative writing skills on issues of social interest ranging from Dowry to Female Foeticide.

The Society has, since last year, also been engaged in organizing the Vishnu-Prabhakar Memorial Debate competition. This success of last year was repeated this year at the intercollege level. As part of the same event, an extempore competition was also organized for visually challenged students on 8 February 2012.

Women's Association, Delhi University, organized a street play on cancer. The LB team participated in it. The same play was later staged in LB and Non Collegiate on Sunday.

English Literary And Debating Society Cum Film Club

English Literary and Debating Society cum Film club of College initiated its calendar for the current academic session with an event on Irom Sharmila, the Manipur poet-entitled Tales from the Margins. The event began with the screening of a documentary film – entitled My Body My Weapon – made by the filmmaker Kavita Joshi. This was followed by an interactive performance by the theatre group – Kankhowa – an initiative headed by Samudra Kajal Saikia. Delhi – based civil rights activist, Matab Alam, along with other members of an NGO, discussed the need to

repeal the AFSPA (Armed Forces Special Powers Act) in order to restore justice and dignity to people in the disturbed states where this brutal law is being implemented. A well publicized event, it drew a huge response and many of our students felt enthused to enlist for the Support Sharmila Signature Campaign.

The Society held an inter class Extempore competition on an array of topics ranging from the worship of cricket, to the merits/demerits of the semester system and the Facebook phenomenon.

The society, in collaboration with the Department of English, arranged a screening of Peter Brooks' Mahabharata. The Society also organized, what has now become its annual feature, a creative writing competition. Prize winning entries have been printed in the College Magazine.

Committee on Affirmative Action

The Committee on Affirmative Action, under the able guidance of Dr. M.P. Yadav has done its best to bolster the interests and welfare of category students. Nine differently abled, visually impaired students have been granted a scholarship by the All India Confederation of the Blind, Delhi.

Thirty physically challenged have been provided with Braille books, Recorded Audio Cassettes and CDs of E-Texts.

It has also been recommended that the college directory and magazine be made available in Braille for visually impaired teachers and students.

Building Committee

Lakshmibai College has relentlessly been striving to upgrade the infrastructure and to meet the demands of a modern system of education. The college has recently been refurbished with state-of-art technology.

The Food Technology Laboratory and Sports Complex (including the gym area) have almost been completely renovated. The toilets in the library have also been renovated.

External Lighting and Solar Lighting systems have been installed in the college, a glimpse of which can be seen during night.

The Administrative Department, Accounts Department, Alumni Room, Union Room and staff room are fully air conditioned.

Fire estingishers and fire fighting equipments have been installed in college.

A massive seepage was witnessed due to the incessant rainfall last year which affected major areas of the college. The first phase of roof renewal treatment has successfully been completed to combat the problem.

The front garden pocket A, near the nursery, has been redeveloped with brick work, green grass and plants.

Some-projects – like the renovation of the front gates and the providing of CCTV cameras – are in process.

Thus, it is with satisfaction, we conclude, that the developmental curve-on the growth graph of our college – is on the rise and we hope to build and strengthen our position year after year.

Gandhi Study Circle

The Gandhi Study circle organized a lecture on the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti on 28 September

2011. Prof. Ashum Gupta, Director, Gandhi Bhavan of Delhi University, delivered a lecture on The Relevance of Gandhian Views in Modern Times.

The study circle, on the occasion of Martyrs' Day also organized a talk by Prof. R.P. Sinha, JNU on Gandhi and Kala Gandhi's favourite bhajans were sung by the students. A group discussion on the key tenets of Gandhian philosophy was also conducted.

Medical Committee

To mark the occasion of World Health Day, the Medical committee of Lakshmibai College organized a Free Health check –up camp in the first week of April 2011. The camp was a joint effort of Lakshmibai College and social action Foundation in collaboration with Medanta the Medicity hospital, PHD family welfare foundation, Friends Associates and Delhi State AIDS Control society to organize this first-time-ever event. The objective was to meet the health information needs of students and staff. Hon'ble Minister of women and child Development and social welfare, Prof. Kiran Walia inaugurated the camp. Prof. J.M. Khurana, Dean, Student's Welfare, Mrs. Anuradha Goel, PHD FWF, Dr. J.L. Jain WUS and Prof. J.L. Jain were present as the guests of honour. Other speakers of note were Padmashree recipient and urologist, Dr. N P Gupta; renowned Breast Health consultant, Dr. Hemant Singhal; neurologist, Dr. Atma Ram Bansal; and gynaecologist, Dr. Sonal Batla.

Facilities included eye testing, blood pressure, blood sugar and haemoglobin testing. Even complex tests like lipid profile, ECG and Uroflowmetry were made available. Consultations were provided by noted urologists, neurologists, cardiologists, gynecologists, ophthalmologists, oncologists and dermatologists. Three general physicians were also there and some prescribed medicines were distributed free of cost to the under privileged.

A street play was staged and a mobile van was stationed to create awareness about HIV/AIDS. Nearly six hundred fifty students and one hundred sixty five staff members, including over one hundred sixty five staff members, including over one hundred underprivileged students, availed the opportunity enthusiastically and made the camp a huge success.

A trained, qualified and registered nurse, appointed in mid 2011 has been appointed to attend to the first aid need of students and staff. Later in the year, the Medical Committee, in collaboration with the Students Union and the Music and Dance Society, led a team of ten students to send their entries to the Medico Masti Youth Festival at the MTNL Health Mela and our students – Himani Sharma, Charvi singh and preeti – did us proud by bagging II, III and consolation prizes for inter-college on-the-spot slogan writing, poster making and mehendi competitions respectively.

In January 2012, the Medical Committee and the Department of food Technology, in collaboration with Marico industries, also organized a health talk by Mrs. Kanupriya Khanna, a consultant Nutritionist and Dietician, on the importance of low glycemic functional foods for optimal nutrition.

NESDALF

NESDALF (Society of Students from North eastern States, Darjeeling, Ladakh and Foreign Countries) is a common platform for students from the above mentioned regions. Previously known as the North-east Society, it was in 2012, re-christened as NESDALF since it is comprised of students from various regions besides north east India. The society is primarily concerned with the welfare of its student members and aims at representing the diverse cultures

of the regions its members hail from.

Proctorial Board

The Proctorial Board aims at maintaining discipline and order in college. A number of activities were organized by the Board. I-card checking at the entrance gate, to take an example, is a routine security measure. Other key concerns include the Anti-ragging campaign, disallowing the use of cell phones in classrooms and corridors, disallowing student cars in the parking, maintaining a silence zone and maintaining a tobacco free zone.

A first-time ever annual function of the Board was organized in college. DCP Meenu Chaudhary was invited to grace the occasion. She spoke about the special service provided for women by the Delhi Police and urged students to avail of these services.

Certificate and cash prizes were distributed to active participants of the Board.

Garden Committee

The front lawn pocket A, near the nursery, will shortly be developed, by a landscape specialist, with fine brick work to perfection. The extensive planting of seed saplings and lay – out of grass beds has been achieved through the tireless work of grass beds has been achieved through the tireless work of Ms. Nirmal Kanta from the Department of Political Science.

Maintainance And Cleanliness Committee

The Maintenance and Cleanliness Committee, with the assistance of Sulabh Karamcharis, have left no stone unturned to (i) ensure the regular supply of water, particularly in the washrooms; (ii) provide dustbins all over college; (iii) remove leakages in taps.

Rooms are kept clean and tidy. Library bookshelves are dusted and kept clean on a regular basis.0

The History Society

The society screened a Documentary film on Soviet History on 16 September 2011. The screening was well-attended by students.

A talk by prof. Arvind Sinha (CHS, JNU) on The Rise of Absolutism in Early Modern Europe was held on 8 November 2011. It received spectacular response.

The History society is also planning to organize a one-day academic trip to various historical monuments of Delhi in the month of February/March 2012.

BBE Department

The BBE Society of Lakshmibai College, is actively working on organizing seminars, workshops, talks, student presentations and conducting interactive sessions with teachers as well as the corporate bodies of different companies.

This year the society organized a talk on India: Development Perspective on 28 September 2011 by Dr. H.S. Gill (Chief Economist, Human Settlement Management Institute Research and Training Wing of HUDCO, New Delhi). He spoke on the current economic scenario of our country within the context of the larger global economic crisis situation.

The society also organized a workshop on career counseling on 14 October 2011. The Resource Person was Dr. Ajay Kumar Singh from the Department of Commerce, Delhi school of Economics. Participant response was overwhelming.

The BBE Society also organized the annual inter-college festival-impetus-on 8 February 2012. The Chief Guest was Prof. Suresh Agarwal from the Department of Business Economics, South Campus. Coordinators of all the BBE colleges were invited along with a team of students. The five chief attractions of the festival-Business Plan, Just a Minute, Quiz, Ad-mad and T-shirt Painting – were a big hit with teachers as well as students.

Mathematics Department

The Mathematics Department organized a UGC-CSIR sponsored National Workshop on the Application of Mathematics in Industrial Research in college premises on 19-20 January 2012. The keynote speaker was Prof. B.K. Dass. The guests of honour included Prof. P.L. Jain and Prof. Sushil Kumar.

Dr Kaushik began her welcome address by talking about the importance of Mathematics in industrial and strategic sectors which lead to technological innovations. She also spoke about S .Ramanujan and his life and achievements as 2012 is being celebrated as National Mathematical year to mark the 125th birth anniversary of Ramanujan.

The workshop sessions were addressed by eminent speakers. Prof. A.M. Mathai, Director, centre for Mathematical Sciences Kochi, spoke about the basic concepts about differential equaltions and calculus and their applications in industry. Prof. P. Seshu, Head, CMMACS, CSIR spoke about the technological aplicatins of Mathematics which include-Robotics, Antenna, Biomedical Devices and Automative Application. Prof. P.C. Jha discussed the optimization models used in marketing. He also spoke about model building processes and their application. Prof. Aparna Mehra, IIT, Delhi spoke about portfolio optimization and investment portfolios. She also spoke about the Harry Markowitzand MAD (Mean Absolute Deviation) model proposed by Konno and Yamazaki. Prof. K.P. Somam, Amrita University, spoke about partial differential equations and image processing. Prof. C.S. Lalitha, Delhi University, spoke about the application of game theory to wireless networks. Prof. V.K. Katiyar spoke about the design and implementation of manufacturing processes and other applications. Prof. V.K. Jain, JNU discussed time series analysis and its area of application with reference to transfer of information to a system.

The workshop received an overwhelming response and was attended by 110 undergraduate Mathematics students, 66 teachers from various colleges and the staff and students of Lakshmibai College.

Participants came up with the following recommendations: (i) the importance of creating awareness about the growing importance of Mathematics through workshops, seminars, research projects: (ii) identifying problems of industry; (iii) forming linkages with research labs for training/internship of students; (iv) need for setting up a centre for Research in Industrial Mathematics in collaboratin with Industry, CSIR and other teaching and research institutions.

The workshop ended with a vote of thanks by Dr. Beena R. Gupta, Co-ordinator, Mathematics Department.

English Department

The Department of English, in collaboration with National Translation Mission, Central Institute of Indian Languages and the Ministry of HRD and in media partnership with Sakshi Bharat, Delhi News Track and A2Z News Channel, organized a two – day national Seminar on the Relevance of Translation in a Global Era. Dr. Amar Nath Amar, Director, Doordarshan, was the chief Guest. Guests of honour included Mr. Pramod Kureel, MP, Rajya Sabha and Member of

Standing committee on Higher Education, HRD Ministry; Dr. Arvind Singh, Joint Director, Ministry of Defense.

The first session of the two day seminar was chaired by Prof. Sambudha Sen who spoke about translation as the most powerful way of disseminating literature and considered it a major feature of English Departments all over India. Prof. Bhim Singh Dahiya went on to trace the history of transition right from the time of the British in India and spoke about how British Orient lists had translated texts written in Indian Languages to imperial languages and vice versa.

In the second session, Dr. Shashi Kumar from the National Translation Mission (NTM) spoke about the origin, role and vision of NTM- its main aim being that of the promotion and publication of text translations in various languages, the creation of a wide pool of translators in diverse areas and the need for developing bilingual dictionaries as a primary research tool for translation studies. Dr. Tharakeshwar from the English and Foreign Languages University, Hyderabad, Stressed upon the need to create a database of translation and to understand translation studies as an inter-disciplinary area of research. Dr. N. Manohar Reddy from the University of Hyderabad discussed translation in the context of Dalit Literature.

The seminar ended with a note on the rise, spread and future of translation studies in India.

Commerce Department

COMSPECT, the annual academic festival of the commerce society, in collaboration with the institute of company secretaries of India, was organized on 2 November 2011. It was very well responded to. Its key highlight was an investment awareness programme on Capital Markets and Mutual funds. The chief speakers were J.K.Bareja and G.P. Madaan.

The programme aimed to raise student awareness on the functional knowledge of capital markets and mutual funds in India. The event was particularly well attended and well received by students.

The commerce department also organized an industrial cum pleasure trip to Chandigarh and Simla from 25-28 January 2012.

Department Of Food Technology

The department of Food Technology organized an exhibition-cum-sale in February 2011 on the occasion of the College Annual Day. A wide variety of processed food products – such as cakes and biscuits, dehydrated vegetables, jams, squashes, ketchep, chutney and pickles – were on display and sale. A lot of teachers in the food science/technology department at the institute of Home Economics and Vivekanand College also came to the exhibition.

National nutrition weeks was celebrate in September for the fourth year in a row. Weight and height were measured and Body Mass index was calculated to assess the weight status of Students as well as staff members. Other highlights of the event included a poster making competition centered on the theme of nutrition awareness and a recipe competition incorporating sprouts. The students managed to strike a balance between culinary innovations and nutritional guidelines and came up with an array of nutritious salads, snacks and desserts.

Apparel Design And Construction

The department of apparel Design has started two add-on Certificate courses on Textile Design and Basic Dress Designing with an aim to impart knowledge to students who wish to learn basic fashion skills and to enhance their creative skills. These courses have received a great response

from students across all streams and are running successfully in the College.

Apparel Design and Construction had organized a seminar on Effective Dressing up in the month of February 2012 in college premises. The lecture was a great success and was very well responded to.

The department of ADC organized a Fashion Show at Vividha to showcase the garments designed and constructed by the students of ADC. This Endeavour was the first of its kind where ADC students got to stage their self-designed and constructed outfits on the ramp. Some of the outfits were also modeled by the ADC students.

An exhibition of garments made by the ADC students will also be organized on the college Annual Day.

Computer Lab For The Diffrently-Abled

The computer lab for the differently abled (VH) is functioning very satisfactorily. Students participation is very good and many students attend the lab for learning computer skills. A seminar was held on Daisy Technology based talking books on 23 February 2011 in college premises under the UGC awareness programme slot during the XI plan period. At the seminar, a typing skills competition-using SAFA software —was organized. The student response was stupendous. Four of our students appeared in the CCC examination conducted by the Department of Electronics, Government of India in October 2009. All four students cleared the exam. Three more students have enrolled for CCC exams to be held in February 2012 by the DOE.

One computer Applications students at the B.A (Prog.) level has performed very well in the Final Year of University Examinants.

The lab is equipped with seven computer systems installed with latest version of JAWS 11 and Kurweil 100, version 12. Safa is loaded on the systems to help students acquire typing skills in Hindi and English. Fee concession is offered to this category of students. Also compute skills are imparted in the lab free of cost to encourage students to attend the lab.

National Service Scheme

The NSS unit works on different projects to sensitize students towards various social issues of note. Nearly 278 students enrolled in the NSS this year. The NSS unit of our college has primarily been engaged in reading and recoding lessons for visually impaired students and organizing coaching classes for under-privileged children. NSS volunteers have been engaged in organizing seminars and workshop. This year we collected clothes and blankets with the help of an NGO called Goonj. Volunteers also participated in Anti smoking campaign organized by DU. A poster making competition was organized in college premises. Five NSS students also participated in an inter-college debate Dyal Singh College.

NCC – Scaling New Heights

The Vibrant National Cadet Corps (NCC) wing of our college has gone on to do as well in 2011 – 12 as it has in the past. We began with enrolling 160 cadets. INTER - COLLEGE

In Inter-college competitions, Lakshmibai College emerged Champion in Baseball, Cricket, Volleyball, Weight – and Power Lifting; stood II in Judo and Wrestling; and finished III in Chess. We won another 6 bronze medals: 2 in Power Lifting – Neha, Sandhya; 1 in Wrestling – Radha; 1 in Judo – Sushma in open wt.; 1 in Boxing – Radika Shankar; and 1 in Athletics- Savita in Long Jump.

DELHI STATE

Individually we won a total of 36 medals including 12 gold medals: Kavita, Priyanka Yadav, Kavita Bhandari, Priyanka in Yoga; Sushma, Pratibha in Judo; Chanchal, Ritu and Sapna in Cricket, Pratibha in Wrestling; Prena and Harshika in Boxing.

10 silver medalsL Jyoti, Dhanwanti, Jyoti Devi and Pooja Pawar in Yoga; Pratibha in Judo; Neelam and Savita in Athletics, Priya in Gymnastics; Chanchal in Cricket; Prena in Boxing.

14 bronze medals: Pooja, Jyoti, Dhanwanti, Shalu in Yoga, Rajni, Tamanna Sharma, Bhawna, Shsuma in Judo; Sonia, Neelam, Sonia Dhankar in Athletics; Priya in Gymanstics; Harshika in Boxing; and Prena in Taekwondo.

In the Women's Festival, our College Volleyball team emerged as winners defeating Jaunti Club in the finals, while our kabaddi team finished IV.

OPEN TOURNAMENTS

Our Kabaddi Team stood III in different All India Kabaddi Tournaments held at Baghpat, Dankaur, Dadri and Rohini. In North Zone Nationals Yoga Competition Kavita Bhandari won the gold medal while Priyanka Yadav earned a silver medal.

Our Volleyaball team emerged Champion in SPARDHA-Sports Festival organized by Amity University; Yoga team emerged champion in open Delhi State; Judo team stood in 17-20 years as well as II in women's section; Volleyball team won the II spot in YMCA Volleyball as well as III position in Open Delhi State; Chess team stood II in SRCC Sports Festival; and Power – lifting team stood II in Delhi State Bench Press Competition.

In the LSR Sports festival, we stood I in Volleyball; in Chess; and III in Table-Tennis. Meenakshi Panwar was adjudged the Best Volleyball Player; Dhankhar was declared the Best Athlete. In the same tournament, we won a total of 10 medals including 3 gold; Sonia in Shot Put; Sonia in Discus; Sushma in Judo.

Two Silver medals; Sonia in Javelin Throw; Anjali in Chess.

Five bronze medals; Radha, Hansa in Judo, Monika in Chess, Bebita in Shot Put, Mridhu in Table Tennis.

We won the Bharti Cup Cricket tournament for the third time defeating Gargi College in the finals, with our students winning the titles for Women of the Tournament- Sapna; Best Bowler – Mandeep Kaur; and Best Batsperson – Sapna.

In different Delhi State level tournaments, we won a total of 14 medals including 4 gold; Yoga-Kavita, Priyanka Yadav; Judo- Sushma, Pratbha; Bench Press- Neha, Babita, Sonia, Sunita.

4 Silver: Yoga – Jyoti Dhanwantio; Judo-Hansa, Shikha Mittal; Bench Press – Preety Kumari and Shikha Dhanda.

6 bronze medals; Yoga-Pooja Shalu; Judo – Pratiha, Pallvi, Preetika, Sushma.

In all, we won a total of 135 medals including 57 gold; 32 silver; and 46 bronze medals at

different levels of competitions. In the field of sports, LBC has become one of the top two best performing colleges in the University of Delhi.

The Department of Physical Education also successfully organized the DU Inter-college Volleyball and softball championship for women.

STATUS OF AUTOMATION OF ACCOUNTING PROCEDURES AND STUDENT INFORMATION SYSTEM

The process of automation in these spheres is in full swing. Paper work has been completely replaced by computerized Information Reports. Programmed Software is ORCALE 10G/11G/Windows 2000 Server edition based. Pay/Pension slips/ Deduction statement, Annual Income statements, Tax Calculation Sheets, Form 16, cheque Printing (all categories(, bank Lists for salary / Pension disbursement, Cashier's Cash Book / Imprest Register, Balance Sheet Schedules and Miscellaneous Reports are Automatically generated with initial Data Entry on Programmed Software. The Daily Voucher Entry System has been in operation for the past two years.

Student Register and mark sheet have also been generated through software based programmes. All categories of certificates (character, Migration, Bonafide and College Leaving Certificate) issued to students will be generated through programmed software w.e.f. this year student attendance record and Reports will be generated through programmed software w.e.f. 2011-12.

Another added feature this year is the Computerization of Leave-related Data for both the Teaching as well as Non-Teaching Staff.

Wi-fi Connectivity has been provided by Delhi University in the Accounts and Administration wings w.e.f. this year.

The institution has purchased original ORACLE Software (5 user) with registered compatible windows 2000 server Version. ORACLE based software programming, provided by Bright InfoTech, has wide adaptability and is capable of yielding multiple formats of required output. We hope to do better in the years to come.

LIBRARY AUTOMATION

The college library has been fully automated using Libsys Software. Approximately 83,000 books have been put into the Automation Process. The library has undergone renovation and now has its own computer unit catering to the students and teaching faculty of the college. There are two computer units one each on the ground and the first floor. Library tickets and Library – I cards have been computer generated for staff and students. OPAC (on line public access catalogue Facility) has also been provided for users since November 2008. The Library has also purchased a scanner Gun for greater efficiency on the issue/Return Counter. Wi-Fi Connectivity has also been provided.
