

WHAT IS PHILOSOPHY?

- Philosophy literally means "the love of wisdom"
- It's a way of approaching the world by analyzing the very basic questions about the nature of the universe, the nature of human thought and how these two are connected.
- There is hardly any branch of study which is not related to philosophy as it deals with the core fundamental issues of every discipline.
- It is the foundation of critical thinking, a reflective-critical inquiry motivated by "wonder".



CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

- An internationally acknowledged system.
- Facilitates a learner-centric approach in education.
- Allows flexibility for students to choose inter-disciplinary, intra-disciplinary and skill-based courses.
- Adopts an uniform evaluation system called Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA), across institutions within and outside India.



- 1. Core Course (CC): All compulsory courses.
- **2. Elective Course**: A course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline. There are 2 types of Elective Courses.
- (a) Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: Elective courses offered by the main discipline/subject of study.
 - **(b) Generic Elective (GE) Course**: An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline, with an intention to seek exposure.
 - 3. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): This Courses are of two kinds:
- (a) Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC): Courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement -- Environmental Science, English Communication/MIL Communication.
 - (b) Skill Enhancement Course (SEC): Courses chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based instruction.

Learning Outcome-based Curriculum Framework (LOCF)

- Introduced in DU in 2019 as per UGC guidelines to offer a new vision to all UG courses
- Works within the framework of CBCS
- Provides a focused, outcome-based syllabus to structure the teaching-learning experiences in a more student-centric manner
- Aims to prepare the graduate students for both sustainability and life-long learning.






