CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

- Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), is an Internationally acknowledged system that allows students to select interdisciplinary, intra-disciplinary and skill-based courses depending upon their interests and aims.
- Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) is adopted to:
- 1. Bring uniformity in evaluation system and computation through grading system, which is considered to be better than the conventional marks system.
- 2. Introduce uniform grading system in the entire higher education in India, benefitting the students to move across institutions within India and across countries.
- 3 Enable potential employers in assessing the performance of the candidates.

OUTLINE OF CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM.



- 1. <u>Core Course</u>: A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.
- 2. Elective Course: Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.
- 3. 2.1 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: Elective courses may be offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).
- 4. 2.2 Generic Elective (GE) Course: An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure is called a Generic Elective. P.S.: A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.
- 5. <u>3. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)/Competency Improvement Courses/Skill Development Courses/Foundation Course:</u> The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: AE Compulsory Course (AECC) and AE Elective Course (AEEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. They ((i) Environmental Science, (ii) English/MIL Communication) are mandatory for all disciplines. AEEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.
 - 3.1 AE Compulsory Course (AECC): Environmental Science, English Communication/MIL Communication.
- 3.2 AE Elective Course (AEEC): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based instruction.

STRUCTURE OF B.A. (HONS.) SANSKRIT





The B.A. (Hons) SANSKRIT programme is of three years, each year divided into two semesters, thus making total of six semesters. Each semester will consist of fifteen weeks.

The programme includes:

- Core Courses (CC) all compulsory courses
- Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)
- Elective courses Ability Enhancement Elective Course (AEEC)/Skill Enhancement Course (SEC)
 - -Discipline-Specific Elective (DSE)
 - Generic Elective (GE)

To acquire a degree in Sanskrit a student must study:

- Fourteen CCs, Two AECCs, Two AEECs/SEC, and thereby earn a minimum of 140 credits.
- Four DSEs and Four GE
