- As a student of sociology you are required to study, think critically and reflect on various topics such as inequality, class structures, identities, conflict and change, and ultimately be informed by distinct sociological ways of thinking.
- As a student of Sociology the aim is to seek deep appreciation for the complexity and the possibilities of lived experience in a fast-changing world. It will help build core skills and knowledge that are essential in today's workplace and establish a strong foundation for your future career.



COURSE STRUCTURE AND OBJECTIVES

- The B. A (Hons) is a three- year course, each year divided into two semesters, thus making total of six semesters.

 - Generic Electives (GE)
- ➤ Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)



UNDER CBCS BA (HONS.) SOCIOLOGY

To acquire a degree in B.A.(hons.) Sociology, a student must study:

- 14 Core (compulsory) Papers through semesters I-VI
- 4 DSE (Discipline specific Elective) Papers through semesters V-VI
- 2 SEC (Skill Enhancement Course) Papers through semesters III-IV
- 4 GE (Generic Elective) papers through semesters I-IV
- 2 **AECC** (Ability Enhancement compulsory Course) papers through semesters I-II
- Project work/Dissertation is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in solving / analysing /exploring a real life situation / difficult problem.
 A Project/Dissertation work would be of 6 credits. A Project/Dissertation work may be given in lieu of a discipline specific elective paper.

SEMESTER 1 CORE PAPER I - INTRODUCTION TO SOCIOLOGY I CORE PAPER II -SOCIOLOGY OF INDIA I

- BA Hons. Sociology will provide a very dynamic orientation to students. It will help develop the skills to analyse and interpret today's social developments and problems, and carry out you're own sociological investigations.
- All the introductory papers provides a foundation for the other more detailed and specialized courses in sociology at later stage.
- These papers offer a broad introduction to the discipline of sociology. It familiarizes the students with the history and some of the fundamental concepts and concerns of the discipline.
- PAPER 1: Introduction to sociology offers a foundation to various theoretical perspective and thinkers. It also allows students to get familiar with the nature and scope of sociology as a discipline aswell as its relationship with other social sciences. The course aims to provide a general introduction to sociological thought and basic sociological concepts such as process of Socialization, Structure function, social control and change, to name a few.
- Paper 2: Sociology of India introduces the processes and modes of construction of knowledge of India. Further, it aims to draw attention to the key concepts and institutions which are useful for the understanding of Indian society.
- The focus is on studying from the original texts to give the students a flavour of how over a period of time thinkers have conceptualized various aspects of society.

- Sociology as a discipline will give you the knowledge and skills to tap on various dynamic job opportunities. It involves lectures, workshops, panels and other activities, all designed to help with your studies and equip you for the world of work.
- You will gain transferable skills in:
- a) research-methods training


