Choice Based Credit System

- CBCS is Choice Based Credit System that provides a vast array of interdisciplinary, and skill based courses from which students can choose their paper options depending on their interest and aptitude/aims.
- The University offers a Learning Outcome-based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) for all its under graduate courses, in order to provide well defined learning outcomes, making the teaching-learning process dynamic and goal oriented. It aims to develop critical and analytical skills in the students, enabling them to realise their potential.
- CGPA or Cumulative Grade Point Average is adopted to introduce a uniform grading system which would benefit the students in moving across institutions nationally and internationally.

Get to Know Your Course: B.A. (Hons.) English

The curriculum of B.A.(H)English attempts to familiarise the students with significant texts in world literature, important literary events and movements, understanding of literary theory and above all to approach literature and language in a multidisciplinary manner. Students are expected to be voracious readers and proficient writers. A student enrolling in the English (H) program is expected to have a good understanding and grasp of grammar and the English language.

Some Key Points:

- **Critical Analysis** This course intends to inculcate in its students a nuanced and a keen understanding of literature which would enable then to go beyond a superficial comprehension of the characters, event and plot of the text and unpack the various layers of meaning it holds.
- **Context** The text is contextualised and read within its Historical , Political, Economic, Social context .
- **Literature in the Medium of English** Even though the course is called B.A. (Honours) English student don't just study literature written in English rather they study world literature in the medium of English.

CBCS Structure: B.A. (Hons.) English

B.A.(Hons.) English is a three year programme, each year divided into two semesters, making a total of six semesters.

To acquire a degree in B.A.(hons.) english a student must study:

- **14 Core** (compulsory) Papers through semesters 1-VI
- 4 DSE (Discipline specific Elective) Papers through semesters V-VI
- 2 SEC (Skill Enhancement Course) Papers through semesters 111-1V
- 4 GE (Generic Elective) papers through semesters 1-1V
- **2 AECC** (Ability Enhancement compulsory Course) papers through semesters 1-11
