COLLEGE ACTIVITIES

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

The IQAC Meetings in the year 2019-20 focused on preparations for NAAC SSR submission. Joint meetings with teaching and non-teaching staff were held to discuss and implement quality initiatives in all spheres of college activities.

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell of the college organised a week long Faculty Development Programme on “Paradigm Shift in Higher Education” from April 16th-21st, 2019. Prof (Dr) A K Bakhshi, Vice Chancellor of PDM University Haryana inaugurated this programme. The objectives of the FDP were to enable the Faculty to learn new pedagogic techniques; empower them with innovative teaching competencies, skills and attitudes; provide the participants with experiential learning integrating ICT tools in teaching through group activities and interactions; sensitise the participants towards issues and challenges in Higher education and create awareness about the Regulatory System in Higher Education in India. The programme sessions were conducted by highly accomplished and renowned resource persons such as Prof. Srinivas ICT, NUEPA; Dr (Mrs) Vimal Rarh, Joint Director, Guru Angad Dev Teaching Learning Centre of MHRD, SGTB Khalsa College; Prof (Dr) Neera Agnimitra Head, Department of Social Work, University of Delhi; Dr Namita Rajput, Principal (OSD) Shri Aurobindo College (E), University of Delhi; Dr. Priya Bir, Associate Professor, Department of Psychology, Aditi College, University of Delhi; Dr S R Oberoi, Retd. AEPIC Report

AEPIC organised a *Students' Symposium* on the Draft National Education Policy 2019 on 15 June 2019 in Lakshmibai College. The students actively participated and aired their opinions about the draft NEP 2019. Moreover, Lakshmibai College commenced its first-ever One Week induction program for the newly admitted undergraduate students from 20th to 26th July 2019. Students and their parents were formally welcomed and introduced to the culture of the campus and University.

As the students enter this new phase of college life, they are expected to travel alone and independently. Keeping this in view college organized a special session for their students in association with Delhi Police. The session was conducted by SHO, Ashok Vihar Police Station. They gave some valuable tips to the students as to how to travel safely and some do and don'ts for their safety. The students were asked to download Himmat Plus app and were explained how to use it.

Padma Shri Prof. Dinesh Singh, Chancellor of K.R Mangalam University and former Vice-Chancellor of University of Delhi was invited as the keynote speaker for the second day. Prof. Dinesh Singh made the students aware about the historical importance of University of Delhi. After morning session of Meditation and Breathing exercises third day started with detailed digital initiatives of the college explained by Mrs. Laxmi and Dr. Talat, members of Digital Initiatives Committee. Furthermore, the Dramatics Society of Lakshmibai College – Navrang performed a skit "Chupchaap" on the orientation program of the college. "Chupchaap" was themed around harassment that has become a part of the day in women's lives.

On Day four Dietician Dr. Charu Arora, Assistant professor, Department of Food and Nutrition, at Lady Irwin College who is a Nutrition consultant with a Delhi based health start up, 98fit conducted a session on Nutritional Related Concerns for College going Girls. Dr. Wajiha Mehtab, a trained Dietitian and a PhD Scholar also conducted a session on Decoding food label from a nutritional perspective. The afternoon sessions for next two days consisted of movie screening 'Dangal' and Talent Hunt Rounds – a perfect platform to showcase the hidden talent of these new students. Dr. Narender Kumar who is a scientist guided us on fifth day by taking a technical session on waste management. Family Olympics was held on sixth day. SIP-2019 concluded on a happy note with a

surprise visit by the Star Cast of Movie Jabariya Jodi. Actors Sidharth Malhotra and Parineeti Chopra.

Besides AEPIC organised a seminar on “Career prospects in aviation” on 28th August 2019. The speaker IGIA's representatives Ms. Binny Nasa and Ms. Heena Jindal informed students about pre-requisites and prospects in aviation. Around 120 students attended the seminar. Furthermore AEPIC conducted a career-counseling seminar for students who aspire to become civil servants. The seminar was conducted in two phases. In the first phase held on 8th January 2020 students took an online aptitude test with real time ranks and scores. Mr. Amit Mangtani, one of the faculties at Insight IAS Academy, conducted the first phase of the seminar. In the second phase experts from Insight Academy conducted a closed group talk on 11th January 2020 with the students and gave them tips and motivated girls to pursue this career. Prof. Baliyan shared his preparation tips and techniques with the girls. Prof. Baliyan is the founder of baliyans.com.

For furthering the prospect of students, basic course in smartphone Film Making was conducted. Film and Television Institute of India (FTII), Pune, under its Skilling India in Film & Television (SKIFT) initiative, in association with Lakshmibai College, New Delhi conducted 10 days Basic Course in Smartphone Film Making in Lakshmibai College, New Delhi between 7th-13th October 2019. Ajmal Jami, who is a national award winning documentary filmmaker, conducted the workshop. The course attendees came from Tamil Nadu, Chandigarh, and Bengaluru apart from NCR. Twenty Eight participants attended and successfully completed this course with a film made by each one of the participants on their own by using their Smartphone.

In this academic year, Mentor- Mentee Program as well as Earn while you learn Scheme was the highlighting factors. AEPIC continued with the unique initiative of student internships started last year. This year a total of 23 interns have been inducted for two new tasks, namely, Energy audit (13 interns selected through interview are carrying out the current project.) and E- waste (10 students are enrolled in the e-waste project)

Moreover, AEPIC launched a new add-on course on “Data Analysis and Visualization” which is a 10-week 60-hour certificate program. Women and Legal literacy and English Communication are the successful running courses along with certificate course in French, German, Spanish, Chinese and Japanese. Diploma Course in French has also been started from this academic year.

An offshoot of this, the Clean and Green Society held several events this year: an Induction Programme was held in July 2019; an awareness session – on the importance of a clean and green environment – was held; on 6th September, 2019, a large number of students participated in the "Save Tree and Save Water Rally; on 13th September, a rally was held to spread awareness on garbage disposal; a play performance – on the role of young men and women in the Mission – was put up in college and across the campus; as part of an awareness drive, student volunteers collected garbage and dirt from corridors and classrooms; they also planted saplings in the college campus.

WISHVAS - Project for Underprivileged area of Wazirpur Village

All the student volunteers for WISHVAS are regular. All the volunteers teach Wazirpur kids. All the students come regularly from underprivileged area and settle class wise. Moral education is also provided to them. Through Khel khel Mey Padna Sikho, we indulge them in activities to make them aware about the social issues. Fine Art classes are also arranged for the students-they thoroughly enjoyed making the paper flowers. All the festivals like Independence Day, Diwali and Republic Day were celebrated with the students. One of the volunteers provides physical education which includes yoga and training in self defense to the students. Dance classes are also scheduled for the students.

Proctorial Board and Students’ Union

The Proctorial Board maintains discipline in the college in various activities or events of the college, the board ensures that discipline is maintained in the college. We welcomed the First year students on 20th July 2019 with Tilak ceremony at the entrance gate. The Board also maintained the discipline during the Student Induction Programme of one week. Plethora of events was organized by Union in this academic year. On 16th August, we had Hasya Kavi Sh. Surender Sharma as Chief Guest of Kavi Sammelan for Independence Day celebration. Powered Yo-Yo challenge took place on 20th September 2019. A program on Swachh Bharat Abhiyan was organised on 2nd October 2019. Mr. Jagat Singh Chaudhary(Brand Ambassador, Forest Department, Uttarakhand) spoke on Environment and forest conservation. Another talk on 'Waste segregation and home composting training' was delivered by Dr. Narender Kumar, Swalamban on the same day. Elocution contest on Swacchata in collaboration with Delhi Public Library was held on 4th October 2019. Chief Guest Reeti Mishra shared her views with the students. Dandya Masti on 4th October 2019. Diwali Mela was held on 25th October 2019.

Moreover, actor Suraj Pancholi was invited as a guest during the Freshers Welcome ceremony on 6th November 2019. Principal, Faculty members, students and union members participated in Lakshmibai Jayanti on 19th November 2019. Lecture on Passport Sewa (Ministry of External Affairs, GoI) was held on 6th February 2020. Last but not the least Annual festival Vividha will be organized soon.

OIC

For the purpose of new admissions in 2019, an online (Google) form was created to collect the optional paper names offered by various departments of LBC. Based on the information collected, OIC had made course specific information sheets of optional subjects available to the students. These information sheets along with the subject information were shared with all Teacher-in-charges to facilitate the students to choose appropriate optional subjects. Further, to streamline the data collection during admissions, OIC created an Excel based admission forms, dedicated to each of the Honours and B.A./B.Com. Program courses. These forms are created with a dropdown

feature with the names of Generic Elective (GE) and Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC) subjects available to the students of their specific course. OIC team had supervised the office staff in subject data entry during the admission process and also monitored the intake of students in various subject options. Information related to student intake was shared at regular intervals with the AEPIC, Teacher In-Charges and Time-Table Committee for discussion and deliberation. Optional data for GE (for Honours Semesters III -IV and B.A. / B. Com Program Semesters V and VI) and Skill Enhancement Course (SEC for BA Program Semesters V- VI) subjects was collected from students via online forms. OIC assisted DIC and office team, by consolidating the student data for uploading on the college website.

Digital Initiative Committee Report

The College has a well-designed and updated website in order to disseminate timely information to various stakeholders for transparency. The digital initiative committee is constantly working towards expanding the scope and increasing the operational efficiency of college website which include Online Admissions, students' monthly attendance and internal assessment, pre-filled customized examination form for the students, display of college timetable, dissemination of information to the students through student zone, dedicated link for short-term add-on courses, students and parents feedback, alumni registration, RFID ID card management etc.

In order to make our campus Wi-Fi enabled a new server was installed in the college. This year the college has introduced the new ID cards powered by Visa/MasterCard. The card has wider acceptability inside and outside the campus. The student can do online payments and ATM withdrawals using this card. In pursuit of providing knowledge in the field of ICT, college took the membership of ICT academy.

“WINGS” Placement Cell

The year began with a valuable seminar on “CV writing and interview handling” as a capacity building programme was also conducted on 18th October, 2019. As a part of campus engagements, several of our students have been selected by reputed organizations

like Wipro, Genpact, Tata Power Delhi Distribution Ltd, which conducted campus placement drives in our college premises. A whopping 64 candidates across diverse background applied for the Wipro campus placement drive that was conducted on 16th January, 2020. 3 HR's from Wipro visited our campus and a total of 7 students were selected. Next in line was Genpact campus placement drive that was conducted on 4th February, 2020. 92 students applied for the placement drive offering various profiles like banking, insurance, finance and 16 of them got selected.

Placement Cell and Creativity, Innovation and Entrepreneurship Cell hosted an interactive session with "WOMENNOVATOR" and "BE BEAUTIFUL BE YOU" on 12th Feb 2020 to enrich our students in a way to enhance their inner as well as outer beauty. Four esteemed panelist were there for this session. A session by Vedica Scholars Programme for women was also conducted in the month of February, 2020. Tata Powers Delhi Distribution Limited in association with Co-Cubes conducted an online preliminary test on 5th March, 2020 for the placement. Moreover, Internship round the year were provided to the students for various profiles like HR, social media marketing, NGO volunteer, sports leader, content writing, campus ambassador programmes, public relations, graphic designing , etc. Reputed companies like Decathlon, Uneako , Eat my news , Sharekhan , Finlatics , Felicia retail, Asmi, selected students to provide internship. Some companies offered stipend as well. Companies for internship were provided throughout the Year.

One of the most successful events of the year was conduction of Internship fair (INTERN-O- WINGS) on 2nd March, 2020. A total of 887 online registrations and 190 offline registrations were made. 40+reputed companies were on board like Sharekhan, Bajaj capital outlook, DU express, Stayrific and Artyson etc. Along with all the campus engagements activities going on, the placement cell was not behind in mediating off campus drives from esteemed companies like Deasche rank, tresvista , Lido Learning, Chegg etc. With these achievements Placement cell is planning to wind up this academic year by publishing a newsletter of the cell and distributing certificates to the ever enthusiastic and efficient team of students.

The Literary and Publication Committee

The committee aims to enhance the literary skills of the students, to bring to light the hidden talents among them, and to conduct various literary events providing a platform for expression of thought through various forms of writing. Apart from this, it is solely responsible for publishing an annual magazine “JYOTI” of Lakshmibai College. The magazine is a perfect amalgamation of all kinds of interest and literature in four different languages, English, Hindi, Sanskrit and Punjabi.

The committee also takes care of publication of the “ANNUAL REPORT”, highlighting achievements of students, faculty and important activities undertaken in the college throughout the year. The committee organised events like” POSTER MAKING” and” CREATIVE WRITING” in this academic year, where in an effort has been made to encourage freedom of expression amongst the students.

The Creativity, Innovation and Entrepreneurship Cell

We embarked on this journey with the first meeting in the month of July 2019 during induction programme conducted by college. Creativity, Innovation, Entrepreneurship cell and Placement cell hosted an interactive session with " WOMENNOVATOR" and " BE BEAUTIFUL BE YOU " on 12th February 2020 to enrich the students in a way and to enhance their inner as well as outer beauty. Approximately 215 students attended this programme in Gargi bhagwan. Four esteemed personalities were present for the session. A two day workshop was also held in the month of February that was " MITTI KE BARTAN CHAK PE KAISE BANATEY HAI" on 14th February and 19th February 2020, the venue for this workshop was open courtyard of the college premises. Approximately 250 students and faculty members participated in this workshop and learnt how to make Mitti ke bartan on chak. A visit was also paid at Hunar Hatt (MHRD), India Gate where students learnt how the self help groups work and how they make their products.

Music and Dance Society

Music department and its society remain active throughout the year. The society and department play a major role in college events like Independence day, Republic day, Gandhi Jayanti, College Annual day etc. In this academic year students of the music department & Society presented Gandhi bhajan & Saraswati Vandana in college's National & International seminars respectively. Many students participated in Inter college competitions in which student of music department Shubha Pandey got First position in event 'Sur ke Sartaj' organized by Bharati Vidyapeeth (Deemed University) & consolation prize in event 'Mehefile Ghazal' organized by Mata Sundari college (D.U.). Apart from that Society's western dance group 'Swayy' took part in several events organized by several colleges i.e. Sir Aurobindo college, Gargi college, IIT Guwahati, IIIT Delhi, SRCC, Lady Shree Ram college, Lady Irwin, PGDAV college, JDM college, Mata Sundari college and so on. The students of the group got 6th position in Guwahati out of 35 teams.

Navrang- The Dramatics Society of Lakshmibai College

The 2019-20 Session began with the skit “Chup-Chaap” for new entrants of the college at the orientation programme. Various workshops were organised in the beginning of the session to introduce first year students to the world of theatre. “Everything is Fine” and Street Play on Education System are the two significant annual productions of the year 2019-20. With over 40 performances in colleges like Gargi, DTU, SRCC, Shaheed Bhagat Singh College and many more, the society made a valuable impact in the theatre circuit. Navrang performed its Annual Street Production at National School of Drama. IIT Roorkee Street Play Prelims were hosted in the college where theatre societies from different colleges participated in the event. A 30 day Theatre Workshop was organised in the college to enrich the theatrical skills of the students. The society secured 1st position in an inter-college stage play competition at Kalindi college, where Vartika Pandey was conferred with the Best Actor prize. Team Navrang performed its annual stage production in Gargi College where Radhika Gakhar, Ritika Kakkar and Vartika Pandey were given a special mention for “Best Performers”. The society is planning to organise an annual theatre fest “Kalamay 2020” in which colleges of Indraprastha university and Delhi university will participate in the Nukkad Natak Competition.

Sanskrit Literary Society

The Society remained busy throughout the year. Our Students participated in many Inter-College-Competitions such as ‘Prashanmanch’, ‘Shlokavritti’, ‘Bashan’, ‘Chitrakarma’ etc. One of our students Richa Jha (M.A. Final year) went to Shyama Prasad College, University of Delhi to represent our college in ‘Ekal Shlok Sangeet Pratiyogita’ and won ‘protsahna’ prize on 17th October 2019. She brought large number of prizes to the society in this academic year - participated in Gargi College in ‘Bhashana Pratiyogita’ and won 2nd prize on 30th October 2019; participated in St. Stephens College in ‘Bhashana Pratiyogita’ and won 3rd prize on 23rd January 2020; participated in Gargi College in ‘Bhashana Pratiyogita’ and secured 1st position on 4th Feb 2020; participated in Maitreyi College in ‘Bhashana Pratiyogita’ and secured 3rd position on 18th Feb 2020; participated in Hindu College in ‘Vaad-Vivaad Pratiyogita’ and secured 2nd position on 19th Feb 2020; participated in Satyawati College in ‘Prachinkavyeshu Aadharita Kavyapatha Pratiyogita’ and won ‘protsahna’ prize on 29th Feb 2020. Two of our students Riya (3rd year, Hons.) and Pooja Mishra (2nd year, Hons.) went to Hansraj College, University of Delhi to represent our college in ‘Prashanmancha Pratiyogita’ on 27th Feb 2020. Another student Sandhya Bhatt (3rd year, Hons.) has also represented our college in ‘Shlokavritti’ competition there. The active participation of students shows that the teachers and the students have been enthusiastically working for the welfare of the society and College.

Gandhi Study Circle

The celebrations on the 150th Birth anniversary of Gandhiji commenced with Gandhiji Ji’s favourite Vaishnav Jan followed by the Bhajan ‘Thumak Chalat Ram Chandra’. Then there was Prathana Sabha with readings from Bible, Geeta, Shri Granth Sahib and Quran. Principal Dr. Pratyush Vatsala observed that students should maintain cleanliness and follow Gandhiji’s ideals and principles. The celebration ended with Raghupati Raghav Raja Ram in which everybody joined. The Gandhi Study Circle organized a Poster making and Essay Writing competition on 14th. February 2020. The theme of the poster making competition was “Mahatma Gandhi – His ideologies of peace and love”, while

the topic for the essay writing competition was “How relevant is Mahatma Gandhi today”.

The Library Committee

2019-2020 saw the culmination of a number of planned improvements in the Library infrastructure. The second floor of the Library now boasts of a Conference Room with a sitting capacity of around 90 people. The room is fully equipped with up to date technology, like an 85” touch panel screen, which would be put to fruitful use in future. Besides this, the floor has also been renovated to incorporate large picture windows to make it well-lit and brighter and a spacious study room with new furniture has also been added to the same. In addition, new clear flooring with well spaced furniture, and proper shelving has added value to the Library set up.

Furthermore, in the ongoing process of adopting new software, the Library switched from LibSys to KOHA software formally in 2019-2020. In use [worldwide in libraries of all sizes](#), KOHA is a true enterprise-class ILS with comprehensive functionality including basic and advanced options. It includes modules for acquisitions, circulation, cataloguing, serials management, authorities, flexible reporting, label printing, multi-format notices, offline circulation for when Internet access is not available, and much more.

Besides, the Library Committee of Lakshmibai College organized Book Fair 2020, on 28th February, 2020 in the open courtyard. As the annual acquisition of books for various disciplines is done through the Book fair, the Library would be purchasing around 500 books from the vendors. The highlight of the Book Fair was its inauguration by Mr. Rajesh Singh, Deputy Librarian, Central Reference Library, University of Delhi. He also gave an enlightening lecture on “Research and publication in E-info environment” for the faculty members. He spoke at length about features of E-platforms, E-resources, search techniques etc.

Enabling Unit for Differently Abled

The Enabling Unit of the college provides assistance and guidance to the differently abled students of the college throughout the year. During the admission process 2019,

counseling was provided to all the differently abled students who came to seek admission to different undergraduate courses. The admitted students were then guided to apply for different scholarships/fellowships provided by government and non-government organizations. An interactive session with the Help The Blind Foundation (HTBF), a Chennai based NGO working to elevate the economic condition of the visually impaired students in India, was organized in the college. HTBF also awarded scholarships of Rs. 71,250 to 7 visually impaired students of the college.

Visually challenged students were issued special software ('JAWS', 'NVDA', 'SAFA') enabled laptops to improve their academic progress. An effort to purchase digital record player with internet facility (Evo E10) is under process, this will be of great help to the visually impaired students in their academic pursuit.

Parvarish Day Care Center

Parvarish Day Care Center at Lakshmibai College is a step towards women empowerment and retention of talented employees. Young parents on the Lakshmibai campus now have a new support platform for raising and grooming their kids. The College inaugurated its Creche Cum Day Care center Parvarish on 25th October 2019. The crèche was inaugurated by Shri Gopal Rai, Minister for Employment, Development, Labour, General Administration and Irrigation in Government of Delhi.

As many as 25 kids can be admitted at the Center at a time. The Center is open for children of 6 months (infant group) till 10 years of age. This will be especially helpful to the women as it will ease their stress on looking after their kid while they are working.

The Center is operational from 8.30 am to 5.30 pm and is divided into three slots—half day, full day and even day-wise for its employees. It fundamentally caters to taking care of infants, play group and After School Care Program. The curriculum centers on social and emotional development, cognitive development and developing creative arts.

The day to day running of the Center has been outsourced to an external agency Eurokids, a pre-school and play group chain. Besides being equipped with all the fundamental facilities, the Center is armed with all the modern technologies. An app based service through CCTV can enable parents to remotely watch what their kids are

doing at the Center. The Parents Connect group gives a constant update on the activities of the child to the parents.

Reports of Respective Departments

Department of Commerce

Even before the onset of the academic session, the Commerce department was abuzz with activity with M.Com Pre-Entrance Coaching classes being held in the college premises during the summer vacations from 10th June 2019 to 21st June 2019 for the students of LBC and the economically weaker girl students from other colleges. The classes were a huge success and got an overwhelming response from the students as they helped them in various subjects to crack the exam. Next in line was the Orientation Programme of the Commerce Department which was organised under the umbrella of the Student Induction Programme in Lecture Theatre 1 on 26th July 2019.

As highlighted in the event calendar, a talk was organised on “Careers in the Field of Finance” on 18th October 2019 in room no 57. Mr. Rishi Thaparria, the head of placements and corporate relations for ICOFP, Bajaj Capital group of companies addressed the gathering. He informed the students about various career opportunities in the field of financial planning, which is a growing industry in today’s era. Another event was a seminar on the topic “Peep into the World of Intellectual Property Rights” – a Power Seminar in collaboration with The ICT Academy on 26th February 2020 held in V-1. The resource person was Ms Prity Khastgir, an international speaker on Strategic Aspects of amalgamating Information Technology with Cyber Law and business in Industry for Spectrum Era. The students were introduced to the concept of Intellectual Capacity or IC and how to identify one's IC and use it to create IPR. In addition to the above events, the Commerce Department plans to organize its Departmental festival “Comspect”, which will encompass various inter college events like debates, quiz, ad-mad and similar inter college events.

Department of Economics

The Economics Society (ÉPARCUS) that has been shaping the mind of new economists began the year with the election of the office bearers on 18 September 2019. A seminar

on 'RETAILER MARKET POWER AND MERGERS' was conducted by Ms. Srishti Gupta, Ph.D. scholar at the Delhi School of Economics on 27 September 2019. With a micro-theoretic framework and interesting case details, the seminar introduced students to new questions and approaches in doing research. A seminar organised on career vision titled 'STRIDE TO SUCCEED' was guided by Ms. Reenu Gupta, Sales Management Advisor, IBM India on 4 October 2019. Introducing career prospects after graduation, she led an exercise in individual SWOC analysis, followed by a technical session on Advanced Excel as used in the corporate sector, concluding the lively session by highlighting the importance of soft skills. In the coming days, ÉPARCUS plans to organize the 9th edition of the annual inter-college Economics Festival BREAKEVEN with events such as *Vichaar Vimarsh*-let your wisdom be your voice, *Grid o' wit*-know more to throw more, *Econquiz*-survival of nimble witted, and *Bid Pool 2.0*-the best way to stick to your budget is never go over budget.

Department of BBE

BBE (Bachelors of Business Economics) Lakshmi Bai College is a synergy of new ideas, new dreams where students get ample opportunities to soar high to conquer new vistas. The department is involved in a melange of outdoor and indoor activities that keep the students busy in reaching out to their peers and the community, welcoming each moment of service. An 'orientation program' was organized for the freshers of the Business economics society.

A trip to Dharamshala and McLeod Ganj was organised from 9th October, 2019 to 12th October, 2019 where the students visited the Tea Factory to gain the industrial experience besides visiting the beautiful temples. They also learnt about balancing their lives from Mother Nature while trekking in Triund. A seminar was organized on 8th November in LT2 to introduce us with the career opportunities in marketing, advertising and management by Mr. Arun Kumar.

To add more accolades to the department we participated in the event Roisters which is a 4 days event held at Aryabhata College of the Delhi University from 16th to 19th January and took part in various activities such as kho kho, basketball, leg cricket, badminton, carrom, chess etc. Our team won one gold, two silvers and a bronze medal in

their respective sports. A workshop on Data Science was organised in collaboration with Microsoft on 29th January, 2020, for training and educating the students on various facets of Data Science, intensifying applications of new technologies, coding, machine learning, business intelligence, supervised learning, unsupervised learning, reinforcement learning, KNN applications, gradient descent algorithm, convolutions and much more. A motivational session for accelerating the growth in career by Mr. Naveen Chaudhary was organised on 4th March, 2020.

Department of English

The Department of English kick-started the academic year with an Orientation session on 27th July 2019 for its Honours students organized under the aegis of the Student Induction Program. The students played literary games, initiated by the student members of the “Rhetoricians” and were presented with a memento – a poster leaflet, a first of its kind in the tradition of the department.

“Narratives” being the chosen theme of the Orientation Lecture Series this year, we were fortunate to have two eminent academics, Prof. Udaya Kumar from JNU and Dr. Ira Raja from the University of Delhi to take us through the complexities of the theme. Their presentations were respectively entitled “Narratives, Thoughts and Emotions” and “Life as Text: Narratives of Age in Indian Fiction”. While Dr. Raja’s presentation was an extended reflection on the arresting theme of ‘Death’ and ‘Ageing’ and the narrative space they occupy in Indian Fiction, Prof. Udaya Kumar’s talk seamlessly straddled literary and socio-historical narratives. The lectures were invigorating and the many questions that followed were a measure of the engagement of the audience.

Furthermore, the department teaches a substantial component of dramatic texts and to bridge the gap between a pedagogical and performative understanding of these, a theatre workshop was held on 11th November 2019, organized by “Rhetoricians” and conducted by Kuljeet Singh, the creative head of Atelier Theatre. Three otherwise colloquial words “Chai”, “Kursi” and “Pankha” were given to the participants as they grappled with the idea of expressing various emotions through just a lexicon comprising of these words. It

was a treat to the observing students and faculty members as the workshop aimed at transforming written words into action.

Besides in this academic year, we had two seminars – one National and one International. A two-day UGC sponsored National Seminar on “Speaking Silence: History, Politics and Psychology” was held on 23rd October 2019 and 24th October 2019, organized by the Department of English, the Convener and Co-Convener being Dr. Pratyush Vatsala and Dr. Sucheta Chaturvedi, respectively. The seminar witnessed a total response of 113 participants and 39 paper presentations. Eminent academics, film and theatre personalities as well as accomplished resource persons from the field of Politics and Psychology were a part of the event—Prof. Chandrakala Pudia, Prof. Nandini Sahu, Prof. Girishwar Mishra, Dr. Nilofer Kaul, Dr. Arjun Ghosh, Dr. Sanjay Kumar, Dr. Anil Aneja, Dr. Raj Kumar, Dr. Joy L.K. Pachuae, Prof. H.S Prasad, Prof. Aruna Broota, Mr. Rahul Rawail, Vimla Mishra , Chandan Mitra, to name a few. An array of issues, concerned with the theme of “Silence” were raised, discussed and debated upon.

A Three Day UGC Sponsored International Seminar and Workshop On “Innovative Teaching, Learning and Evaluation in English: Harmonious Transition from School to University” was organized under the aegis of the Department of English, between January 23rd to 25th, 2020, in Collaboration with Trinity College, London. Dr. Pratyush Vatsala was the Convener of the event. Dr. Elaine Boyd (Associate Academic, University College, London), Prof. Kapil Kapoor, (Chairman, IAS) , Mr. Vineet Joshi (IAS, Director General of NTA), Major Harsh Kumar (Secretary, NCERT), Dr. Geeta Rai (Assistant Professor at CIE) Prof. Sandhya Sahoo (English, NCERT)), Dr. Sanjay Verma, Dr. Mukti Sanyal (Officiating Principal at Bharti College, University of Delhi), Dr. Vinod Kumar Singh (Assistant Professor at Department of English, University of Delhi), Dr Sanjay Verma were some of the dignitaries and speakers present in the seminar. The seminar focussed on the pedagogy of English Language teaching in India and abroad, and as reflected in the title, the deliberations revolved around infusing creativity into pedagogical practices. Dr. Boyd introduced the MARGE Principle of

learning, MARGE being the acronym for five essential principles of learning: Motivate, Attend, Relate, Generate, and Evaluate.

Furthermore, department runs a Film club. This academic session, the film club of the Department of English began with a screening of a gripping courtroom drama, a 1957 American Classic *12 Angry Men*, which examines the tenuous nature of guilt and innocence. The movie, screened on 04th September 2019 was duly introduced and was followed by a lively discussion session. The film club also screened the South Korean movie *Parasite* on 31st January 2020, which later on went on to win many awards and accolades as a social satire. The last screening of the season, *Jojo Rabbit*, shown on 21st Feb 2020, is set against the backdrop of Second World War and the danger of Nazism/ Self-destructive Nationalism. The Film Club will continue to screen such edgy and topical cinema in order to make the students come out of their comfort zone and think out of the box.

The Department of English, under the guidance of Teacher-in-charge, Dr. Ruchi Mundeja, is working towards putting a small Department library in place by the beginning of April. The unique feature of this is that this is conceived as an entirely co-operative project, with books and material curated and contributed by faculty members going towards making a small beginning of this venture possible. Its modest beginnings notwithstanding, the spirited involvement of the student members and the commitment of the teachers needs to be acknowledged and bodes well for its future growth.

Department of History

The Department of History organized an “Educational Tour of the Heritage Sites of Delhi- Red Fort and *Purana Qila* (Old Fort)” on the 02nd November 2019 , for the students of various courses, and the Faculty members of the Department - Dr. Geeta Arya , Dr. Vrishti Kanojia, Dr. Gitanjali Dey, Dr. Mekhala Chakma and Mr. Rakesh Kumar accompanied the students. The first destination visited was the Red Fort and the students saw the *Diwan-i-aam*, *Diwan-i-khas*, *Rang Mahal*, *Nahr-i-Bihist* ,etc. The Museum within the Red Fort was an appealing highlight of the visit as it exhibited the history of the Revolt of 1857. Then the students headed for their second destination, the *Purana*

Qila (Old Fort) and visited two Museums inside the fort—the Archaeological Museum and a newly inaugurated Museum by Union Culture Minister Mr. Prahlad Singh Patel. It was a mesmerizing and capturing display of various artefacts and antiquities like coins, copper plate inscriptions, sandstone *stupa*, sculptures, etc. of different historical phases of Indian history.

On 14th February 2020, the Department organized a Talk cum Poster-Exhibition on “Understanding Growing Sexual Violence in Contemporary Times”, by Dr. Maya John (Assistant Professor, Jesus & Mary College, DU and Women’s Rights Activist with Centre For Struggling Women, CSW). Dr. Maya John while underlining the history of sexual violence in India discussed the various causes and nature of sexual violence as well. A Poster-Exhibition on the history of Women’s Movement in India was also held in the Courtyard of the College. The Posters displayed varied themes – demand for justice for victims of sexual violence, child abuse, female infanticide, domestic violence, dowry, and campaigns against caste based discrimination.

Department of Hindi

The Department of Hindi organized a dialogue on "Literariness of Film Songs". On 20th September, " Hindi Day" was celebrated. Events like – essay writing; poster making; memory writing; self-written verse recitation; and folk song singing – were organized; Prof. Pooran Chandra Tandon delivered a lecture on “Relevance of Hindi and Translation in the Global Perspective and its Development”; a film screening on *Sadgati* was organized. This was followed by a discussion on Shyam Benegal’s direction techniques and a film adaptation of literary texts.

"World Hindi Day" was celebrated on 10th January 2020. A discourse was organized on the "Protection of Public Property". On the occasion of "World Mother Language Day", 19th February, an essay writing competition – on "Expression of Social Reality in Folk Songs" – was organized.

Department of Food Technology (Home Science)

The department of Home Science (Food Technology) celebrated National Nutrition Month in the month of September in collaboration with Nutrition Society of India (NSI) - Delhi Chapter and under the ambit of NetProFAN initiative of FSSAI. The keynote address was given on 25th September by Dr Seema Puri, Associate Professor, department of food and nutrition, Institute of Home Economics (IHE), University of Delhi, who deliberated on the transition in Infant and Young Child Feeding Practices in India. Second speaker was Dr. Bani Tamber Aeri, Co-convenor, NSI- Delhi chapter and Assistant Professor, department of food and nutrition, IHE, who spoke about the objectives and activities of NSI.

Nearly 80 students from eight colleges including Lady Irwin College, Bhaskaracharya College of Applied Sciences, Shaheed Rajguru College of Applied Sciences, Aditi Mahavidyalaya, Bhagini Nivedita College, Institute of Home Economics, and Shyama Prasad Mukherjee College, actively participated in the intercollege competitions. In essay writing on 'Combating undernutrition in first 1000 days of life' Shaheed Rajguru and Lady Irwin College shared I position, while Lakshmibai College and Institute of Home Economics got II and III position respectively. In display board competition on 'Eat Right India', Laksmibai College bagged I and II positions while III position secured by Bhaskaracharya College of Applied Sciences. An intercollege competition on 'Healthy Iron Rich Recipes' was also held where Lakshmibai College bagged I and III positions, while Bhaskaracharya College received II position.

A lecture series for students by dietitians Wajiha Mehtab, Charu Arora and Sakshi Chopra was also organised on 20th and 27th of September on four different topics - Health claims on food labels, Safe and nutritious food, Tackling obesity among college girls and Addressing undernutrition. The highly applauded entrepreneurial project of the department - Nutri Bite entered its fourth year and was inaugurated on the occasion of Rakhi on 9th August. Megha Jindal of BA (Prog) FT III year was the Project Investigator, and she led a team of 12 students successfully to put up seven stalls serving safe and nutritious savouries and sweets to students and staff of the college through out the year. A stall on innovative biscuits was put up in October. Cranberry muffins, Pineapple Upside Down cakes, Rainbow canapés & Nutri Sevpuri and Beetroot

Dimsums, prepared and sold in the months of January and February, were greatly appreciated by the staff and students.

The department initiated a new student project 'Development of edible cutlery - an entrepreneurial project' to standardize edible cutlery from cereals and millets as a sustainable solution for combating the use of plastic spoons. Jyoti Chaurasia, Monika, Nisha and Sujeta of BA (Prog) FT II year developed and standardized six variations and got the sensory evaluation done on a Hedonic scale.

Our students proved their mettle by winning many Intercollege competitions against tough competition this year. Few of them deserve recognition. Namra of BA (Prog) FT II year won I prize at the two-day University Chef Culinary Competition, Season 5 held at Shyam Lal College 5th -7th March, 2020. Suman Bharti of BA (Prog) FT II year won I prize in Intercollege E-poster competition on 'Swachh Bhojan Surakshit Ahaar' organised by Nutrition Society of India, Delhi Chapter. Shrishti and Dhvani of BA Prog FT II year bagged I prize in Intercollege 'Healthy recipe formulation using fortified foods' organised by the Department of Food Technology Bhaskaracharya College of Applied Sciences on 21st February, 2020. Vanshika Gera of BA (Prog) I year competed with honors and masters students of Delhi University at Lady Irwin College for 'Feeding smart from the start' recipe contest on 6th September, 2019 and bagged an award for her infant premix recipe 'Wheat Gruel' prepared from dehydrated carrot and sprouted wheat. Students attended national seminar on 'Technology intervention to eradicate malnutrition in India' organised by All India Food Processors' Association (AIFPA) on 5th March, 2020, at Pragati Maidan, New Delhi as well as a seminar organised by department of food and nutrition, Lady Irwin College on the theme 'Food systems and dietary diversity – facing the challenges on 21st century' on 28th February, 2020.

Department of Apparel Design and Construction (Home Science)

The Department of Apparel Design and Construction took up various student projects -all of them underlying the environment friendly approach. In line with the green endeavour of the college, the ADC green crusaders came up with solution to replace plastic bags, replacing them with reusable fabric bags. These are namely, "Designing and Development of Reusable Fabric Bags" where faculty and students have created stylish

and useful fabric bags in various sizes and shapes. In order to provide dust safety to volunteers working for the clean and green mission of Swachh Bharat, another student project was taken up “Designing and Development of Headgear, Face mask and Gloves”. Useful headgears, face masks, and gloves were developed to be used while implementing such missions, using old fabrics. “Development of Environmentally Sustainable Reusable Technology for Women Hygiene” project with key elements comprising environment friendly, practical usage, low-cost method of production of Sanitary Napkins.

Students also enthusiastically participated in Wall graffiti for Sparsh Ganga- A National River Rejuvenation Campaign, inaugurated by Shri. Manoj Tiwari, Member of Parliament, Delhi. They were much appreciated and applauded for the same. The department organised a workshops on “Lippan art and Puppet making” and “Knitting Workshop”. The college faculty and students created several interesting wall-décor pieces using the techniques taught in these workshops

Design Studio- ADC entrepreneurial Venture took place in the months of August and October. This year the collection included several hand- crafted articles for the festive season. It gave students an understanding of practical marketability of traditional crafts. ADC students participated in inter-college events and won at various platforms viz. Rashi Aggarwal and Mansi both students of BA (Prog.) 2year secured 1st position for Designing Dress out of Waste at Miranda House, University of Delhi. They attained 1st position for creating Dress out of waste at Lakshmibai College, University of Delhi. ADC students along with faculty members went for an educational visit to Craft Fair, Dastkar - Society for Crafts and Crafts people. The garment construction and designing for the annual Fashion Show by the ADC students at Vividha, is in progress. A department exhibition will be put up on college Annual Day. The focus is on reducing carbon footprint by repurpose, restyling of the existing resources

Department of Mathematics

In the academic session of 2019-20, the Department of Mathematics conducted an election for the post of President, Vice President and other office bearers for its society ‘Mathletes’ in the month of September.

In the month of November (dated 15th November 2019), to get the students enthused about how mathematics play an important role in day to day lives, the Department organized a talk on 'From tricks to techniques in Mathematics'. The session was chaired by renowned speaker, Prof. Shobha Bagai (Professor, Cluster Innovation Center, D.U), who introduced the tricks and techniques used by different professionals in their day to day lives. The talk enlightened and inspired the students to use and develop techniques for their future. On 26th February 2020, the society organized a lecture which was aimed to familiarise the students about M.Sc. Operational Research. The invited speaker, Mr. Arun, guided the students about the Masters programme in Sciences. The Department is also planning to organize an annual get together event for all its students and teachers in the month of April 2020.

Department of Philosophy

The Department of Philosophy in each academic semester organizes different events to enhance excellence in students. On 4th October 2019, the Department had organized "Career Avenues 2019" at the Lecture Theatre-1, Lakshmi Bai College. The keynote speakers were Mr. Aditya Patel, Assistant Director, Directorate of Personnel, DRDO, Ministry of Defence and Mr. Shiv Kumar, District Social Welfare Officer, Hathras, Uttar Pradesh. They spoke on administrative capability and efficiency and gave hindsight of due process in the preparation for competitive exams. The enthusiasm in the students was more vivid when they heard the way forward in career building as they listened and interacted with half a dozen of their passed out seniors. Some of the alumni are employed as sub-editor at India TV News and employed as Delhi Police; while the others continue with their studies in Master in Philosophy and Management.

On 6th March 2020, the Department had organized the One-Day annual Indian Council of Philosophical Research (ICPR) Periodical Lectures at Vishwakarma Bhavan – I. Dr. Sashi Motilal, Professor, Department of Philosophy, University of Delhi had delivered on the topic "An Alliance Beyond the Realm of Ecological Justice," and traced the trajectory of history and contemporary ecological issues. The second speaker, Dr. Ajay Verma, Associate Professor, Centre for Philosophy, School of Social Sciences – I, Jawaharlal

Nehru University, New Delhi spoke on “The Concept of Self in Indian Philosophy.” The perennial philosophical issues of self, soul, mind, identity etc were discussed in the light of contemporary challenges. In the upcoming events, the department is due for organizing a talk on “How to have a successful job interview” by Ms Anupriya.

Department of Political Science

As a regular practice followed every year, this year the session began with the orientation programme of the students. The programme conducted awareness about the syllabus and students clarified their doubts regarding their course. The first activity to take place was a Talk on Article 370 which was organised on 23rd of August 2019. Our keynote speaker was Shree Ashutosh Bhatnagar, Director of Jammu and Kashmir Study Centre. Workshop on Parliamentary Committees and their functioning was held on 27th of September 2019. The keynote speaker for the workshop was a senior bureaucrat Dr. Raghav P Das. Mr. Das talked about various parliamentary committees; how they are appointed and how they function. Furthermore, Educational trips to Rashtrapati Bhawan were conducted on 31st January & 7th February 2020. The guide told students a number of interesting facts about Rashtrapati Bhawan, the story behind its construction President’s lifestyle etc. To ensure that the students develop their academic skills, our department had organised different activities - Painting competition (24th January 2020) on ‘Incredible India’, Essay writing competition (29th January 2020), Debate competition (19th February 2020).

Department of EVS

Department of Environmental Studies had organized some worthy academic activities during the session 2019-20. Department had organized a one week cleanliness program “Swachh Bharat Abhiyan: Ek Jan Andolan” under Clean and Green Mission (Ecoclub) in collaboration with Student Union from 27th September 2019 to 2nd October 2019. Highlights of the program were cleaning of complete college campus by students, teaching and non-teaching staff; an awareness rally in Ashok Vihar colonies and market complex situated in areas surrounding the College. Dr Oam Prakash Sharma Vidyarthiji

(IFS) Principal Chief conservator of Forest, J&K gave a tree talk and explains the importance of forest conservation to the students. Waste segregation and compost training was given by Dr Narender Kumar, Director, Swavlamban, an environmentalist and entrepreneur. The one week program was concluded with the closing program with a highly motivating, inspiring talk of Shri Jagat Singh Chaudhary Jangali ji a well known Environmentalist and Brand Ambassador of Uttarakhand Forests.

Another one day workshop was organized by the Department with the title “Sharing Nature Experience-Connect with the nature” by Sharing Nature India an NGO.

Organizers Mr Manu Sharma and Mrs Archana Sharma trained the students that how to get connected with the nature and understand the real meaning of the existence and also learn to maintain harmony with nature. Department had also organized a one day E waste management awareness program in collaboration with Action in community and Training (ACT) and Karo Sambhav an NGO. Dr Gurpreet Kaur, an environmentalist the speaker gave some very important information on proper disposal of E waste generated by human being.

Department of Punjabi

Punjabi department conducted many events this year. Our students presented a ‘Shabad’ on Gandhi jayanti and participated in poster making competition. Our students participated in Quiz competition at Ramanujan College. Two Students from our college. also participated in poetry competition at SGTB Khalsa college and won 2nd prize . Department of Sociology

The new session proved to be another year of excellence for the department. Both faculty members and students participated in array of activities and forums. Department of Computer Application

Department of Computer Application taught Programming with Python, Information Security & Cyber laws, Computer Network and Internet Technologies, Multimedia Applications, Computer Fundamentals and Database Design. The students did a series of presentation about digital privacy, digital security, cyber crimes and cyber laws to protect victims in case of any digital crime. The department also introduced Data Analysis and Visualisation, a 10-week 60-hour add-on course open to students from all academic background. The course is framed according to current market requirements. Course includes basic Python and its analysis based libraries like NumPy, SciPy, Matplotlib, Pandas and Seaborn, Descriptive and Inferential Statistics, the science behind data cleaning, wrangling & preparation for analysis, and machine learning algorithms. The project prepares students for data analyst role with two projects on real life datasets (COVID19 and IMDB Movie Review).

International

Delhi State / State Level Tournaments

Our Volleyball team Secured First Position in Youth Delhi State; and 2nd in Senior Delhi State. Our Kabaddi team stood 3rd in Delhi State tournament. Individually, we won a total of 35 medals including 17 Gold, 08 Silver and 10 Bronze medals. The Gold medal Winners were Geeta in Archery; Seema in Athletics; Amita, Nishu & Siddhi in Boxing; Tina in Gymnastics; Diksha in Power-lifting; Saloni, Sukhdeep, Nisha, Nazreen, Kajal, Gajala, Chanchal, Babita, Anupama & Ainam in Yoga. The Silver Medal Winners were Payal in Archery; Nikku & Seema in Athletics; Juhi Sharma & Meenu Maru in Ball Badminton; Kajal, Nishu & Sushmita in Boxing; and Diksha in Power-lifting. The Bronze Medal Winners were Geeta & Hemlata in Archery; Seema in Athletics; Nishu in Boxing; Kanika Singh in Judo; Diksha & Pooja Kumari in Weight-lifting; Laxmi Devi & Pooja in Wrestling; and Bhawna in Yoga.

Overall, we won a total of 113 Medals i.e. 45 Gold, 24 Silver and 44 Bronze Medals at individual level at various levels of competitions including International, National, All India Inter University, Inter College and State Tournaments during the session 2019-20 apart from the Team championships in Inter college and State tournaments.

Our college was allotted the responsibility by DUSC of organising Inter College Softball & Cricket Tournaments, which were successfully concluded. Additionally the college is providing complete spectra of facilities and infrastructure for the above mentioned games. Also Indoor shooting range is under construction in the college premises and will be ready before the commencement of the next session.

National Service Scheme

Furthermore NSS volunteers actively participated in a joint celebration organized by the NSS centre in regard to the occasion of International Yoga day and in Swachh Bharat Summer Internship. In the similar endeavor, we eagerly organised "JAL SHAKTI ABHIYAN " in the campus for awareness and community education on conservation of water. Two Activities were conducted for the same - Jal Shakti Abhiyan Rally and Jal Shakti Abhiyan Movie Screening ("Kaun Kitne Pani Mein"). Concomitantly, on 5th of August, 2019 Josh Talks and UNDP joined hands to take #CharchaForChange - Climate Chapter with an event meant to raise awareness on the alarming issue of Climate Change and capture the innovative ideas for a sustainable and safe future. Four of our NSS volunteers received the opportunity to attend the same.

The NSS UNIT of Lakshmibai College was humbled and extremely honored to be a part of the historical launching of "FIT INDIA MOVEMENT" by our honourable Prime Minister Sh. Narendra Modi on August 29th, 2019. Proudly, 10 of our volunteers were also nominated to attend the live launching of this movement in the INDIRA GANDHI INDOOR STADIUM. "Let us make FIT India a Jan Andolan" were the words stated by our Prime Minister. To promote the same, our unit arranged a LIVE screening of the launching of this movement.

Moreover, the unit organized an orientation program for our newly admitted NSS volunteers, on the 30th of August 2019. All the new volunteers were officially welcomed and introduced to the culture and custom of the Unit. We were honored to have Dr. Shuchi Yadav and Dr. Amrita Shilpi as the dignitaries for the event. Launching of the SECOND EDITION OF OUR E-MAGAZINE supported as an ice-breaking session and gave a gist about the previous activities and events conducted by the unit.

In accordance with the given action plan directed for the observance of Swachhta Pakhwada (fortnight), the NSS unit of Lakshmibai college successfully organized a series of activities from 1st August 2019 to 15th August 2019. The NSS unit of lakshmibai college organised certain activities with regard to NSS week celebration. In an attempt to change the face of our society one bit at a time, the unit organized various activities - on 25th September [Day 1] a Career Counselling Workshop for specially abled students of the college was organized; on 26th September [Day 2] - Red dot cell of the unit took an initiative to create awareness about menstruation - An activity "BURSTING THE MYTH" addressed menstruation, the taboo associated with it, myths and facts; on 27th September [Day 3] - Saksham cell organized a fun quiz on the modern education system with different students across the campus; on 28th September [Day 4] - the unit conducted a clothes donation drive at the adopted slum of the unit, "wazirpur village"; on 29th September [Day 5] - The unit conducted a Health

Mela in collaboration with Tech Mahindra Smart Academy for healthcare for the non-collegiate students of the college; on 30th September [Day 6]- Umang the dramatics wing of NSS performed an inspirational play TULYATA, portraying the ordeals of lives of LGBTQ + community; and on 1st October [Day 7] - Lastly, Urvar cell of the unit successfully completed the mega project under which a ginormous NSS logo was built out of plastic waste, along with Mahatma Gandhi's chattels.

In this academic year, NSS organized seminars as well as workshops. Our students also attended seminars held outside college. NSS Unit of Lakshmibai College in collaboration with Vegan Outreach, an animal advocacy group working to promote veganism through the widespread distribution of printed informational booklets, organized a workshop cum campaign programme in the college premises.

Here, students produce low cost sanitary napkins within the college premises in the most hygienic, affordable , efficient way possible and later distribute the manufactured napkins to the underprivileged women in Wazirpur which is the adopted village of this unit .

To name few – on 9th August an interactive session, rally and shramdan was organized to encourage the students to maintain cleanliness and develop a voluntary and personal interest in the same; on 24th September an interactive and awareness session on plastic waste was organized; on 30th September a fun and learning quiz on education system was conducted; on 21st October students were taught to craft paper bags; on 22nd October a fun activity of flag painting was organized to promote unity and brotherhood; on 4th February poem recitation competition was held to provide a competitive yet uplifting atmosphere; on 5th February an Essay writing competition was organized on the topic Republic India to encourage students to amplify their personal voices and opinions; on 20th February World peace song recitation was organized to encourage and promote the maintenance of peace and love around our respective surroundings; on 21st February extempore competition was organized to provide a competitive yet influencing atmosphere; on 22nd February

different activities such as fun while learning, yoga and hand sanitizing steps were conducted.

Samarpan also organized series of events such as - a career counseling session was organised to help the specially abled students of the college achieve a better insight of the available and potential career opportunities in the outside world; fun activities were organised to help the specially abled students of the college enhance their concentration and indulge in activities of creativity; from this year onwards volunteers were personally available to assist the specially abled students in their academic as well as extracurricular activities. Similarly, Shiksha Cell organized large number of events such as - awareness Drive regarding the Health Schemes provided by the Delhi Government; a survey to acknowledge the health issues faced by many people in Wazirpur village due pollution was conducted and a campaign about the potential and advised precautions to help reduce the risk of developing health issues was organized; a survey on the usage of plastic and the impact of plastic ban was conducted and a campaign on the importance of refusing plastic was organized to address the hazardous effects of plastic usage; a survey on talent and skills of females of the adopted village wazirpur was organized to acknowledge their achievements and encourage them to make something out of their respective passions; a Survey on issues faced by the people of Wazirpur village regarding basic facilities like education, health and cleanliness etc was organized to acknowledge reasons that might have been crucial for the drawback of that particular area; awareness campaign about Tobacco and its hazardous effects on the body was organized to sensitize the people of the adopted village and encourage them to give up on the same.

Umang collaborated with Shiksha cell and taught a play on cleanliness to the children of adopted village, Wazirpur. They also performed on LGBTQ++ community on NSS day. A Play on the importance of voting was organized during the vigilance awareness week. The team also participated in a Competition organized by IIT Roorkee on the occasion of National Social Summit and performed a play on mob lynching for the same. Moreover, Urvar organized posters on awareness, a giant NSS logo was made out of waste plastic to encourage students to recycle and reuse as much as possible, diya decoration for donation

on Diwali. In addition to this, SVEEP conducted an awareness drive on the electors verification programme was organized through room to room campaign. Poster making and slogan writing competition was held to create enthusiasm in the students during elections. Volunteers of this cell organised an interactive session and spoke on some important topics related to elections and voter's education, in which the audience participated equally. They also held oath taking ceremony on National Voters Day.
