

# COLLEGE OVERVIEW



**LAKSHMIBAI COLLEGE** is one of the premier institutions of higher education for women, founded in 1965 as Women's College, later renamed after an inspirational, exemplary and spirited queen of Jhansi, Rani Lakshmibai. It is a constituent college of University of Delhi. The college has its own well-equipped building, sprawling lawns, sports ground and staff quarters. It has a locational advantage as it is in the close proximity of University of Delhi.

The college is on a run to enhance its infrastructural capacity for the students, faculty and non-teaching staff. The newly built infrastructure of the College includes a new Academic Block-Vikramshila that has the latest infrastructure including Classrooms, Labs and also elevators. On 06<sup>th</sup> March 2024 Vikramshila was inaugurated by Hon'ble Lok Sabha Speaker, Om Birla Ji. College also has eight classrooms (porta cabins), a well-furnished computerized library, a creche (Parvarish), an open gym, and a health and wellness centre (Arogyam) with a meditation hall, a fully furnished waiting shed, an administrative block (SPS) (Kautilya Block). The two-storey structure behind library - Vishwakarma Block includes a large Gargi Hall, Labs and classrooms. There is also a common room for

students and an open stage with pavement for cultural programmes. The college entry gate has a solar panel of 76.8 W.

Our college has taken a great leap forward with respect to technological advancement in higher education, with the introduction of advanced student's identity cards powered by Mastercard wherein all the details of students are embedded in QR code. The card accepts online payments, ATM



withdrawals, split transactions, multiple load money options, unlimited add Ons and request money accepted at more than 4mn outlets. We are the first college in Delhi University to go cashless prior to demonetization. Our college has digital display boards, interactive smart boards and digital information kiosk.

At Lakshmibai College, we have highly competent and committed faculty, efficient and skilled non-teaching staff. Our faculty is actively engaged in research, development of new curriculums, undertaking innovative projects, conducting workshops, seminars, symposiums and conferences at national and international levels. A good number of our teachers have authored academic books and research articles in reputed journals. Our college also excels in sports and activities of NCC and NSS. The college gives prime importance to its sports infrastructure, and has recently developed the Jhalkaribai Shooting Range for the students.

Ecopark was developed with the concept of amusement, resource utilization out of waste, recreation of land usage and model ecosystem development for educational purposes. The theme was natural ecosystems. Three different ecosystems - grassland ecosystem, desert ecosystem and aquatic ecosystem are showcased there. To enhance the aquatic biodiversity, a pond ecosystem is also being developed in the college campus with the continuous efforts of Principal, Prof. (Dr) Pratyush Vatsala at Gokul situated on the college campus.



Our students are deeply conscious of the leadership potential of women and they are constantly inspired to build a community devoid of discrimination and oppression. Student's creativity is evident in a wide ranging co-curricular and extra-curricular activities organized by the various societies, and associations working under the guidance of the staff advisors.

Lakshmibai College is committed to academic excellence and the values of humanism. In the past five decades, the college has carved a niche for itself in the field of education in liberal arts and social sciences for women. The college is an extended college with about 3800 students on rolls. The college utilizes its resources to the optimum. On Sundays and other holidays, it doubles up as a teaching centre for the Non-Collegiate Women's Education Board and also a centre for IGNOU.

# FACILITIES

## LIBRARY

The College has a well-stocked, computerized library with internet facility, wi-fi connectivity and a spacious reading room which remains open to students throughout the year from 9.00 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. except Sundays and on gazetted holidays.

The college library committee has been actively involved in improving the library and building its book collection. Access to the library is now available to students and teachers through their smart I-cards. The library committee organizes the annual Book Fair.

Books in the General and Textbook sections are issued for one week only. Whereas, books in the Reserve Section—are issued with advance reservation and with the prior permission of the Librarian. Reference books and periodicals are available for consultation only. The College library has been fully automated and uses Libsys Software. Approximately 87,134 books have been put into the Automation process. The library subscribes to around 45 newspapers and magazines and has a rich collection of various reference sources such as encyclopaedias, dictionaries, Atlases and Yearbooks. The library also provides access to about 500 e-journals, and around 75000 e-books through a host of high-quality electronic databases subscribed by Delhi University System (DULS) to its users. The library has an air-conditioned reading hall and it also has computers for the users. For visually impaired students, Braille books & other facilities are also available in the library. Library Tickets and Library-I Cards have been computer generated for staff and students. OPAC (On-Line Public Access Catalogue) facility has also been provided for users. The library also has a Scanner Gun for greater efficiency on the Issue/Return counter. The library is also in process to provide the E-resources through the NList programme of INFLIBNET.



## Rules

- ❖ College Identity cards are to be produced every day at all service points, i.e. the entrance, the issue counter, the reference section etc.
- ❖ Students will be fined for damage to library books and may even be deprived of library facilities.
- ❖ Loss of books must be immediately reported to the Librarian in writing, failing which the student will be liable to pay a heavy fine including one and a half times the cost of the book. Tearing pages from any library book/magazine will be fined heavily.
- ❖ Students are required to look up the library notice-board from time to time for library rules and regulations and any other information related to the library.

## Seminar Room

The College has an air-conditioned seminar room with state-of-the-art infrastructure with a seating capacity of approximately 100 people. The Seminar Room is well-equipped with various technological gear to support and facilitate a range of seminars and workshops.




## Canteen

Lakshmibai College is equipped with a fully functional, exclusively vegetarian canteen to serve wholesome, nutritious food to the students and staff. The spacious and well-furnished canteen with intercom facility is situated within the campus next to the car park and just at the back of the Lecture Theatre II. It remains open from 9 A.M. till 5 P.M. on all working days and is under the regular supervision of a catering committee consisting of faculty appointed by the college staff council. It provides catering for in-house functions, visitors as well as assisting with provisions for special events. In case of any problems or suggestions the canteen committee can be contacted.



## Gymnasium

The Lakshmibai College is proud to present its modern, up-to-date and fully-equipped gymnasium, an essential feature of the college's robust infrastructure. ## College Laboratories Do's and Don'ts

### Do's

1. Know the location of the fire extinguisher and the first aid box and how to use them in case of an emergency.
2. Read and understand how to carry out an activity thoroughly before coming to the laboratory.
3. Report fire or accidents to your Teaching Faculty/laboratory technician immediately.
4. Report any broken plugs or exposed electrical wires to your Teaching Faculty/laboratory technician immediately.

### Don'ts

1. Don't eat or drink in the laboratory.
2. Avoid stepping on electrical wires or any other computer cables.
3. Don't open the system unit casing or monitor casing particularly when the power is turned on.
4. Don't insert metal objects such as clips, pins and needles into the computer casings. They may cause fire.
5. Don't remove anything from the computer laboratory without permission.
6. Don't touch, connect or disconnect any plug or cable without your Teaching Faculty/laboratory technician's permission.
7. Don't misbehave in the computer laboratory.

**Bank:** Bank of India has an Extension Counter in College. It offers all banking facilities to the staff and the students. The Bank has become an integral part of college life by sponsoring seminars and various college activities regularly.

**Photostat:** The College has a Photostat cabin to provide Photocopy and Print-outs facility on payment basis.

**Transport:** The Routes connecting to Lakshmibai College by the Bus No. are - 166, 181A, 912 and nearest Metro Stations are Keshav Puram, Kanhaiya Nagar, Inderlok, Shastri Nagar etc.

**Crèche:** Young parents on the Lakshmibai campus now have a new support platform for raising and grooming their kids. The College inaugurated its Creche Cum Day Care centre Parvarish on 25th October 2019. The crèche was inaugurated by Shri Gopal Rai, Minister for Employment, Development, Labor, General Administration and Irrigation in Government of Delhi. The Centre is operational from 8.30 am to 5.30 pm. The Centre operates with two floors i.e. Ground and First with fully equipped pantry and child friendly facilities. The centre head and supporting staff undergoes regular training programs for early childhood care. The day to day running of the Centre has been outsourced to an external agency Eurokids, a pre-school and play group chain. Besides being equipped with all the fundamental facilities, the Centre is armed with all the modern technologies. An app-based service through CCTV can enable parents to remotely watch what their kids are doing at the Centre. The Parents Connect group gives a constant update on the activities of the child to the parents.

## Health & Wellness Centre: AROGYAM

The place for knowing yourself at all levels through Philosophical and Psychological Counselling, Medical Advice, First Aid etc.

**Meditation Centre:** The first floor is designed to be a place to know thyself in the purest form of being, to pause and to realize how all the five elements of our body communicate with Nature and the Spirit.

Students can book an appointment for understanding and practice of Mindfulness, Yog asana, Pranayama, Philosophical or Psychological Issues, Counselling, Nutrition or Gynaecologist etc, by sending a mail.



There is a trained and qualified Nurse to look after the first-aid needs of students. Students can take medical help in the Medical Room whenever necessary. Students can avail medical consultation and treatment at W.U.S. Health Centre located at Chhatra Marg, University of Delhi. For this student has to fill up WUS membership form and submit it to dealing (**Membership is optional**). In case of any problems/suggestions the medical committee teachers can be contacted.

## **Yagya Mandap**



To tap into spiritual dimensions and to channelise the energies of human mind in a positive direction, Lakshmibai College has built a Yagya Mandap in the Gokul, situated on campus - a place for performing *havan* rituals.

## **Facilities for Students with Special Needs**

The College provides a sensitive and friendly atmosphere to visually challenged students. It has a fairly large number of such students in all the programs. The College set up a Disability Unit in 2006-07 with the help of a UGC grant in the X plan period under the HEPSN Programme. This unit caters to the needs of students with visual disability. The College is also committed to make them computer literate and to improve their English language skills so that they too construct a universe for themselves.

Counselling and guidance are provided to the differently abled students seeking admissions in our college. The students are helped and guided to apply for scholarship/fellowship and other activities of organized and unorganized sector. Students with visual disabilities are provided laptops with software such as JAWS, NVDA and SAFA' to help them in their studies and other works. A special computer lab known as 'Enabling unit computer lab' was reopened on 3rd October 2016 for them. A computer instructor for skill development is also appointed for visually challenged students.

## **Creative Board**

As a unique space-the Creative Board, provides opportunity to explore the creative potential. The students are invited to share their creative ventures on the CREATIVE BOARD. ## **Email and Wi-Fi**

Wi-Fi facility for students is available in the college campus. Also, an official email-id is provided to the students.

## **Magazine**

The college publishes Annual Magazine "JYOTI", that includes contributions from students and teaching faculty. It has four sections in –English, Hindi, Sanskrit and Punjabi.

**Parent Teacher Meeting (PTM):** The college also organizes parents/Guardians Meeting every year to connect the parents with teaching faculty members.

## Lawn and Sports Ground

The college has lush green front lawns and sprawling sports ground. The students are advised to take care of the cleanliness of the lawns and the sports ground.

- **Mentorship Sessions:** Mentoring of students through Mentor Mentee sessions where faculty members are assigned students for professional and personal counselling.

# POST-ADMISSION AND ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

## **Important Information:**

Once a candidate is selected and takes admission after payment of fees and completing other procedures, she becomes a student of the college subject to the approval of her enrolment by the University;

- ❖ For inter-college migration, college follows the Ordinance IV of University of Delhi.
- ❖ Any student, submitting false/forged/fake certificates, will be debarred from admission to any program, and would be liable to legal action as per the norms of the University of Delhi. Admission can also be cancelled. Such cases will be notified to all colleges and to the police.
- ❖ **Orientation Day** will be organised in the college for the New Entrants.
- ❖ Students will also be informed about the **Student Induction Programme**.
- ❖ Students are advised to check the college website on a regular basis.

## **Academic Requirements and Attendance Advisory:**

The students of the college are governed by the rules and regulations of the University of Delhi as laid down in the Ordinance VII of the University. All the students are required to attend all the lectures, tutorials and practicals regularly. Students not fulfilling the attendance requirement, as prescribed by the University, may be debarred from appearing in the University examinations. Therefore, students are required to maintain attendance as per University Rules. In case of illness, the leave application must be accompanied by a medical certificate and fitness certificate which should be submitted to the college office. Please note that shortage of attendance will not be condoned for attending other programs of study outside the college

**NOTE: All the new students are advised to carry their admissions slip with them.**

**Identity Card:** Every student is given an Identity Card, which she must bring to the College every day. This card must be produced as and when required. Disciplinary action may be taken on failure to do so. If the Identity card is lost, a duplicate must be obtained on payment.

The process for promotion of 4 more faculty members to the post of Associate Professors is in full swing.

## **INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE**

The Internal Complaints Committee of Lakshmibai College remains committed to its role in creating a secure and inclusive academic environment. The collaborative efforts of elected members, engaging events, and educational initiatives aim to reinforce the college's dedication to preventing and addressing sexual harassment issues effectively. The Institution has a transparent mechanism for timely redressal of student grievances including sexual harassment and ragging cases. The institution actively promotes awareness and underscores a policy of zero tolerance towards harassment and ragging. Through organization-wide campaigns and undertakings, we strive to create an environment where all members of the institution understand and uphold the principles of respect, dignity, and inclusivity.

In the academic year 2023-24, the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) of Lakshmibai College conducted transparent and democratic elections. The elections aimed to ensure representation from diverse sections of the college community, fostering an inclusive and accountable committee. In adherence to the guidelines for preventing sexual harassment, the ICC ensured on the college website and in the campus the prominent display of the constitution related to the prevention of sexual harassment across key areas within Lakshmibai College. This initiative aimed to educate and remind all stakeholders of the college's commitment to maintaining a harassment-free environment. The ICC organized students meeting to address concerns, collect feedback, and disseminate information on the prevention of sexual harassment. Additionally, an awareness session and campaign were conducted to educate students about their rights, the complaint redressal process, and the importance of fostering a safe and respectful college community. A talk on POSH (Prevention of Sexual Harassment) by Ms Namita Malik, Joint Director, Personnel and Training, DoPT is planned for 13th March 2024.

## **ACADEMIC IMPROVEMENT INITIATIVES COMMITTEE (AIIC)**

Academic Improvement Initiatives Committee (AIIC) works in collaboration with the departmental in-charges as ex officio members. The committee, under the aegis of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), devises and recommends various initiatives and effective practices to enhance the teaching and learning process, through a series of meetings with the departmental in-charges. AIIC commenced with the task of mentor-mentee allocation for the academic year. Department wise mentor-mentee data was prepared and shared to facilitate the interactions of the students with their mentors. Question Banks for the newly introduced Semester III courses as per the revised NEP syllabus were prepared and existing resources (for Semesters I and V) were updated. Records of the weekly teaching plans, assessment schedules and course completion were collected from all teaching faculty. Also, records of usage of best practices adopted by faculty members such as innovative teaching pedagogy and suitable remedial measures undertaken to meet specific needs of the learners were also gathered. Course Exit Forms were shared for learner's feedback on the odd semester courses and in addition, consolidation and analysis of the university exam results was performed.

## **CREATIVITY, INNOVATION AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP CELL (CIE)**

Entrepreneurial success requires the ability to develop and offer something unique to the marketplace. Overtime, entrepreneurship has come to be associated with creativity, offering something original, more so in the sense of an idea or its representation. The Creativity, Innovation and Entrepreneurship (CIE) Cell, Lakshmibai College operates under the mandate of the 'Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyaan', the vision of a new India envisaged by the Prime Minister Narendra Modi. The aim of the 'Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan' is to make the country and its citizens independent and self-reliant in all aspects. This will make us self-reliant by creating an ecosystem that will allow Indian enterprises to be highly competitive on the global stage. The College has registered itself with the Institution Innovation Council (IIC) under the Ministry of Education, for systematically fostering a culture of innovation along with other Higher Educational Institutions (HEIS) registered with the IIC. CIE Cell is also engaged in organizing the various events as per the recommendations of the council along with its core activities. It also aims to create and nurture an incubation centre to mentor budding start-ups which can be established and run as successful businesses. The three main initiatives of CIE Cell are: Development of the Brand Parampara, Goodwill Store, and Enactus Chapter in the college under social entrepreneurship. The product division of Parampara includes Dhoop Batti, Sambrani Havan Cups, Vermicompost, Pure Honey, Bioenzymes, Mushroom Cultivation, Millet Cookies, and 'Red Dot'-reusable sanitary napkins, which are running successfully in the Udyamita Vikas Kendra.

**PARAMPARA-CIE CELL:** The Cell has collaborated with various organizations for successful running of various projects. Under the Dhoop Batti and Sambrani Havan Cups projects, the cell collaborated with Aryavart Vedic Chikitsalaya Pvt. Ltd. Various MoUs have been signed with the non-profit organization Sewa Bharti for eco-friendly packaging of the Vermi-compost and to provide training to the women of the weaker section of the society. To achieve the objective of community engagement and women empowerment, the Cell has conducted various training and social awareness sessions for these women. Raw material used for the production of Dhoopbatti and Sambrani Havan cups is a mixture of various herbs and organic items. The cloth raw material for the packaging of Vermicompost was collected through a Donation Drive organized by the college. Bio-enzymes are prepared with orange peel, jaggery and water in plastic bottles which are collected through donation drives and hence the Cell makes efforts to reduce the carbon footprint too. A Millet cookie, another product under the Parampara brand, focuses on healthy food intake. Under the 'Red Dot'-reusable sanitary napkins are prepared by the students. Mushroom cultivation and Honey Bee farming are other two projects which are underway. To concern about the responsibility of higher education institution towards society, CIE Cell in collaboration with Centre for Fostering Social Responsibility and Community Engagement organized "Jagrati Saptah" From 16th October, 2023 to 20th October, 2023 in college campus. The main objective of that event was to make the students aware about preserving their environment and their contribution towards society along with paying attention to their financial rights and health and nutrition. On the first day, through "Swachchanjali", the students were motivated to keep their college campus clean. The second day under the theme of "Vittiy Saksharta" was dedicated to develop the financial understanding of the students. On third day, under the theme "Haritima", the students took an oath to protect their environment under Vrikshabandhan. The fourth day was devoted to the reflection on how to empower women as per Indian tradition. In which the main speaker Ms. Vijaya Sharma (Akhil Bhartiya

Taruni Pramukh, Rashtriya Sewika Samiti) gave a new direction to the students through her address. The fifth day focused on women's health and nutrition. In which the main speaker Dr. Nmphiya Valecha (Shiksha Swasthaya Nyas) made the students aware about their health and nutrition. Various competitions and Nukkad Natak were also organized by the members and students of the CIE Cell in this awareness week. On 22 January, 2024 the LB College organized an event under the theme "Tere Mere Sabke Ram" which was dedicated to our Indian culture. Project Anmol, a social welfare project under Women's Development Cell conducted a Children's Day Special that is coming on 14th of November for young children in Rambagh park, one of the study centres run by Gyan adhar Welfare Society on 5th November 2023. The theme of this drive was to celebrate upcoming Children's Day and to spend quality time with them by encouraging and motivating them through an interactive and engaging session. The main motive of the drive was to spend wholesome time with the children as they are one of most loveable people around.

On the tenth day of November, 2023, the Women's Development Cell of Lakshmibai College, University of Delhi organized a book discussion in the college premises in collaboration with In(k)inations- the Book Club of Lakshmibai College, University of Delhi, on the theme: Women, Literature and Leisure;. ### **ORDINANCE XV-B: Maintenance of discipline among Students of the University**

1. All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Vice-Chancellor.
2. The Vice-Chancellor may delegate all or such powers as he / she deems proper to the Proctor and to such other persons as he/she may specify in this behalf.
3. Without prejudice to the generality of power to enforce discipline under the Ordinance the following shall amount to acts of gross indiscipline:
  - a. Physical assault, or threat to use physical force, against any member of the teaching and non-teaching staff of any Institution / Department and against any student within the University of Delhi
  - b. Carrying of, use of or threat to use of any weapons
  - c. Any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act, 1976
  - d. Violation of the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes
  - e. Any practice-whether verbal or otherwise-derogatory of women
  - f. Any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner
  - g. Willful destruction of institutional property
  - h. Creating ill-will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds
  - i. Causing disruption in any manner of the academic functioning of the University system.
  - j. Prohibition of Ragging as per Ordinance XV-C.
4. Without prejudice to the generality of his / her powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of maintaining discipline as may seem to him/her appropriate, the Vice Chancellor, may in the exercise of his / her powers aforesaid order or direct that any student or students –
  - a. be expelled;

- b. be, for a stated period rusticated; or
- c. be not for a stated period, admitted to a programme or programmes of study in a College, Department or Institution of the University; or
- d. be fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified; or e. be debarred from taking a University or College or Departmental Examination or Examinations for one or more years; or that the result of the student or students concerned in the Examination or Examinations in which he /she or they have appeared be cancelled.

5. Institutions, Halls and teaching in the concerned Departments. They may exercise their authority through, or delegate authority to such of the teachers in their Colleges, Institutions or Departments as they may specify for these purposes.

6. Without prejudice to the powers of the Vice-Chancellor and the Proctor as aforesaid, detailed rules of discipline and proper conduct shall be framed. These rules may be supplemented, where necessary, by the Principals of Colleges, Heads of Halls, Deans of Faculties and Heads of Teaching Departments in this University. Each student shall be expected to provide himself / herself with a copy of these rules. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he /she submits himself / herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice-chancellor and several authorities of the University who may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Acts, the Statutes, the Ordinances and the rules that have been framed therein by the University.

## **ORDINANCE XV-C: Prohibition and Punishment for Ragging**

- 1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/ Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
- 2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
- 3. Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students; and includes individual or collective acts or practices which:
  - a. Involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force.
  - b. Violate the status, dignity and honor of women students.
  - c. Violate the status, dignity and honor of students belonging to the scheduled caste and tribe.
  - d. Expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem.
  - e. Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behaviour.

4. The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of college, or University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
5. Notwithstanding anything in Clause above, the Proctor may also suomoto enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
6. The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
7. The Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an inquiry, he/ she may advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
8. When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an inquiry, his/ her decision shall be final.
9. On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3(a), (b) and (c), the Vice Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.
10. The Vice-chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a programme of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
11. In case any students who have obtained degrees or diplomas of the University of Delhi are found guilty; under this Ordinance, appropriate action will be taken under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees or diplomas conferred by the University.
12. For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.
13. All Institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions / directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.

**Order of the Vice-Chancellor in pursuance of Ordinance XV-C:** Where incident(s) of ragging are reported to the Vice-Chancellor by any authority under this Ordinance, the students(s) involved in ragging, shall be expelled for a specified term, designated in the order. Non-students involved in reports of ragging will be proceeded with under the criminal law of India; they will also be rendered ineligible for a period of five years from seeking enrolment in any of the institutions of the University of Delhi. Students against whom necessary action is taken under this note, will be given post decisional hearing, with strict adherence to the rules of natural justice.

## **ORDINANCE XV-D/The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 (MINISTRY OF LAW AND JUSTICE)**

An Act to provide protection against sexual harassment of women at work place and for the prevention and redressal of complaints of sexual harassment and for matters connected there with incidental thereto.

WHEREAS sexual harassment results in violation of the fundamental rights of a woman to equality under articles 14 and 15 of the Constitution of India and her right to life and to live with dignity under article 21 of the Constitution and right to practice any profession or to carry on any occupation, trade or business which includes a right to a safe environment free from sexual harassment;

AND WHEREAS the protection against sexual harassment and the right to work with dignity are universally recognized human rights by international conventions and instruments such as Convention on the Elimination of all forms of discrimination against Women, which has been ratified on the 25th June, 1993 by the Government of India.

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to make provisions for giving effect to the said Convention for protection of women against sexual harassment at workplace. For details, please see the website mentioned below.
