

## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Our Chief Guest, Dr. Kapil Sibal, Minister of Communication & Information Technology Government of India; Prof. Kiran Walia Hon'ble Minister for Education, Social welfare, Women and Child Development, Languages; Shri Hari Shankar Gupta, MLA; distinguished guests, colleagues and young friends.

I extend a warm welcome to all gathered here on the occasion of our college Annual Day. We are honoured to have with us Dr. Kapil Sibal. Mr. Sibal is a very versatile personality, a lawyer by profession, a poet and lyricist by choice and a politician by accident. He was initiated late in life to the political arena – 1998, when he was nominated to India's Upper House of Parliament, the Rajya Sabha from the state of Bihar. In 2004, he won the election to the Lower House of Parliament, the Lok Sabha, and was made Minister of State for the Ministry of Science and Technology and Department of Ocean Development.

Dr. Kapil Sibal was the student of St. Stephen's of Delhi University and he was also nominated as a member of Governing body of his college. He was honoured Doctor of Philosophy degree in the fifty five Annual convocation of Punjab University in 2006. He was designated a Senior advocate in 1983, elected President of Supreme Court Bar Association in 1995 and 1997 also. He was the Leader of the Indian Delegation to the Human Rights Commission in Geneva in 1991, Annapolis Conference in USA held together International support for reestablishment of a Palestine state in November, 2007. He led the Indian delegation to the United National Conference on Climate Change at Bali in December, 2007.

He has held eminent positions as a Member of Parliament, Rajya Sabha during 1998-2004, Spokesperson of the Congress Party during 1998-2004, Elected Secretary, Congress Parliamentary Party during August, 2000-02. He was the member, Press Council of India during March 2001 to 2004, Member Joint Parliamentary Committee (J.P.C) on Stock Market Scam and matters relating thereto during April, 2001 to December, 2002, Member, Executive Council, Institute of Constitutional and Parliamentary Studies, Business Advisory Committee, Committee on Home Affairs and Co-Chairman, Indo-US Parliamentary Forum & Member, Board of International AIDS Vaccine Initiative, headquartered in the US from 2001-2004. He was also the Member, Programme Board of the bill and Melinda Gates Foundation's India AIDS initiative in 2003. He has published a book entitled "I Witness" in August, 2008.

We also have with us Prof. Kiran Walia, Hon'ble Minister for Education, Social Welfare, Women and Child Development, Languages. Prof. Kiran Walia was born in a prominent family of freedom fighters. Her father was closely associated with veteran Sh. Bhagat Singh and worked tirelessly for the nation. Her family members, in the patronage of the Congress, have served the public and country. She started her professional career as a teacher in Lakshmi Bai College of Delhi University. During this period she was the first woman who won with record votes in Delhi University Teachers' Association (DUTA) and represented the Teachers' Association in the Executive and Academic Councils for several years. Thereafter she headed the Teachers' Cell at the All India Congress Committee for three years and was Chairperson of South Delhi District Development Committee. She was Chairperson of Delhi Commission for Women.

She represented India at an International Conference in the USSR. As a member delegate, she visited Malaysia and Melbourne for the Commonwealth Games. She also visited Cambodia and Thailand for the eradication of AIDS. She has presented several Research Papers at many Universities in the country and abroad.

We also have with us Sh. Hari Shankar Gupta, MLA. He initiated his political career in 1977 and was appointed as Treasurer NSUI (Delhi). He was elected as President, Delhi University Student Union in 1978.

From 1986-1993, he was a member of National Council National Joint Secretary and Incharge of Maharashtra, Uttar Pradesh, Himanchal Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh.

From 1996-2005, he was General Secretary of Delhi Pradesh Congress Committee, member of All India Congress Committee and Delegate of Bharat Nagar Block Congress Committee, Wazir Pur.

He has worked on various prominent positions in Delhi University, Public Grievances Commission, Indo South Africa Friendship Association, Ministry of Urban Development Govt. of India etc.

He visited several countries like USSR in 1978, Australia, North Korea, New Zealand, USA, Mozambique, Chekloslovakia, Singapore, UK, Holland, France, Germany and Switzerland.

Lakshmibai College has made Delhi University proud. We aim at the holistic development of our students through awareness generation, better teaching learning facilities, vocational courses and co-curricular activities. The aim is to make our young women students financially independent and completely self-reliant. This is the goal we will keep striving for endlessly.

### **ADMISSIONS AND RESULTS**

In all 3744 undergraduate students are enrolled in the College. The break-up is as follows.

In addition 26 students are pursuing various courses at the post graduate level. Our M.A results have been good in M.A (Sanskrit), M.A (political Science) and M.A (Philosophy) previous year.

The college has done exceptionally well with brilliant results. Final year results are 100 percent in B.Com (H), Philosophy (H), B.Sc (Maths) Hons., Sanskrit (H) and BBE; 95.5 percent in Hindi (H); 95 percent in Economics (H); 87.5 percent in English (H); 85 percent in Political Science (H) ; 75.2 percent in B.Com and 70 percent in History (H). There have been 49 first division in B.Com final year; 42 first divisions in B.Com(H); 25 first divisions in B.A (Prog.) final year and 17 first divisions in B.Sc Maths (H) final year.

Second year results are 100 percent pass score in B.A (H) Philosophy and Sanskrit (H); 96.92 percent in Economics (H); 96.15 percent in BBE; B.Sc Maths (H); 94.82 percent in English (H); 94.54 percent in Hindi (H); 94.28 percent in B.Com; 92.94 percent in B.A (Prog.); 89.74 percent in B.Com (H); 85 percent in History (H) and 84.34 percent in Political Science (H). Apart from this, 86 first divisions in B.Com (Prog.); 56 first divisions in B.A (Prog.); 53 first divisions in B.Com (H); 37 first divisions in Economics (H) and 35 first divisions in B.Sc Maths (H). The BBE students have done us proud by securing as many as 19 first divisions out of 26 students.

First year students have also performed commendably. 93.75 percent in B.Com, 92.30 percent in BBE; 89.9 percent in Hindi (H) and 80.98 percent in B.A (Prog.). There have been 79 first divisions in B.Com, 62 first divisions in B.A (Prog.) and 42 first divisions in B.Com (H); 19 first divisions in Economics (H); 18 first divisions in Political Science (H) and 15 first divisions in Hindi (H).

## COLLEGE ACTIVITIES

### STUDENTS' UNION

The Students' Union enthusiastically organized diverse activities in the year 2012 – 2013. The academic year started with the Orientation Programme held on 20<sup>th</sup> July where the freshers were acquainted with the faculty members and were informed about the various literary and cultural societies of the college. The Independence Day, celebrated on 14<sup>th</sup> August, was marked by rendition of patriotic songs and an essay competition on the topic "What freedom means to me". The much awaited freshers' welcome organized on 22<sup>nd</sup> August was a huge hit and Ms. Aishwarya Raj Khanna won the coveted title of Miss LBC. The "Miss DT contest", held on 29<sup>th</sup> August 2012, sustained its popularity and captured the attention of our students who participated in the event zestfully. Ms. Priya Beniwal emerged as the winner of the contest.

Elections for Delhi University Students Union and the college union were held on 14<sup>th</sup> September, 2012. The newly appointed team took oath on 25<sup>th</sup> October, 2012. The Republic Day was celebrated on 24<sup>th</sup> January, 2013.

To express solidarity with the fight for justice for the gang rape victim Nirbhaya, a candlelight March "Mashaal" was organized on 8<sup>th</sup> January, 2013 in the college premises. More than thousand students and staff members braved the extremely cold weather to join the march and demanded stringent laws and severe punishment for the rapists. An eminent judge from Tees Hazari Court, Mr. Rajesh Goel was invited on 6<sup>th</sup> February to acquaint the students with the recent ordinance relating to sexual offence. A street play against domestic violence was also staged subsequently.

Annual Inter College Cultural Festival "Vividha" was held on 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> February, 2013. Justifying its name, the festival showcased diverse events and performances. The festival was inaugurated by multitalented TV artist and Bollywood actor Mr. Deepak Kumar Chaddha. Different inter-college competitions including debate, poetry extempore, creative writing and quiz were held over several weeks. The creativity and skills of participants in mehendi, rangoli, candel making and flower arrangement were judged through back stage contest. The Snack Contest saw a display of innovative mouth watering dishes prepared by our young chefs. At the Fashion Show, our budding designers impressed everyone with their creative apparels while our talented young models enacted a soul-stirring sequence on sexual harassment and women empowerment.

The team of Jyotsna, Sharanya II (H), Akanksha, Lekha III (P) , Nisha and Bharti I (P) bagged the fourth prize in the Kavyali Competition hosted by Kamala Nehru College. The Sanskrit Literary Society has been aided by the Department of Music, which has contributed significantly to the commendable performance of our students. Maitreyee I (H) got the consolation prize in Sanskrit Extempore competition. At Janki Devi Mahavidyalya Disha I (H) won the II prize in “Chitrakarma” Competition. Our team of Neelam and Sheetal II (H) stood IIIrd in Sanskrit Quiz.



The society hosted two Inter – College Competitions-Recitation and Mantroccharan. In a well contested Recitation Competition, our College was adjudged the best. Since we were the host College, the trophy was awarded to the next winner, Hansraj College. In the individual category our students Bharti I (P) won the 1st prize and Sheetal II (H) the 11nd prize. The society also organized a number of Inter-Class competitions.

#### **HINDI DEBATING AND DRAMATICS SOCIETY**

Under the auspices of this society, a street play was staged on the theme of “Empowerment of Women”. Our team also performed this play in the street play competition organized by Delhi School of Economics. The society held an Inter-Class Debate Competition on the motion: “Cell Phones are a Boon”. The event witnessed an unprecedented participation of as many as 35 students. A unique feature of this event was the open forum provided to the visually challenged students to present an item of their choice, be it a poem, a song or a speech. All the participants in this segment were given certificates and three prizes were awarded for both the categories of the event.

Fourteen teams from various colleges of University of Delhi participate in a closely contested competition. Gargi College won the first prize and was awarded the trophy. Individual speakers were also given prizes for the first, second and third positions. Impressed by the brilliant display of talent, the jury doubled the number of first, second and third prizes.

#### **THE ENGLISH LITERARY AND DEBATING SOCIETY CUM FILM CLUB**

The society set the ball rolling in the current academic session with a screening of “Udaan”, a film that reflects the angst and aspirations of the youth. Its rebellious undercurrent struck a chord with the students. A Poetry-Reading Competition which comprised of two sub-categories— self-composed poetry and enunciation of a printed piece, was organized in September. In a keenly contested event, especially in the self-composed poetry segment, students from diverse streams tapped the poet within them. The next event was a screening of “The Rise of Evil”, a film on Adolf Hitler. The biopic impressed the audience with its scale and psychological complexity. The Creative Writing Competition has become almost an annual fixture for the society and this year the contest took place in February. The topics given, such as “The Unborn” and “A campfire, a scream and a lie that keeps getting bigger.....”, were tantalizingly open-ended, inviting students to both let their imagination roam free and to think incisively on important issues. The society is in the process of finalizing the programme for a Literary Festival.

#### **Building Committee**

In its drive to constantly upgrade infrastructure to meet the demands of a modern system of education and realize its own vision, the college has regularly added new facilities to provide a comfortable working environment for its staff and students. The renovation in the Food Technology Laboratory, Sports Complex including gym area has been completed. The library toilets have been renovated and external lighting and Solar Lighting have been installed in the college, the glimpse of which can be seen during

night. The renovation in the Administrative Department and Accounts Departments has also been completed. The college canteen is a hangout favoured by students and staff and it was recently refurbished with state of art technology and comfortable sitting arrangement.

A massive seepage was witnessed due to incessant rainfall during last few years which affected major areas of the college. To avoid seepage and leakage, first phase of roof renewal treatment was successfully completed and efforts are being made to further extend the project in remaining areas of the college. The college has taken sufficient measures to prevent fire incidents in the college and installed Fire Fighting Equipments in the College.

Air conditioners were provided at various places of the college like Administrative Department, Accounts Department, Alumni Room, Union Room and Staff room. Thus, it is with satisfaction, we conclude, that the developmental curve on the growth graph of our college is on the upward rise and we hope to build and strengthen our position year after year. We have received unstinting support for all our activities, from the members of the Governing Body and Building Committee, to whom I wish to express my deep felt gratitude. I also wish to thank the officials of University of Delhi and University Grants Commission for their assistance and guidance. I express my sincere thanks to both the academic and non-academic staff for their whole hearted cooperation. being the Best Cadet, who also stood 1<sup>st</sup> in solo dance. Our college also won the 2<sup>nd</sup> position in group song, group dance, volleyball and Tug-of-war. The CATC held at Delhi Cantt was attended by 29 cadets. In this camp, our college stood first in drill competition, group song as well as group dance; and JUO Neha Kumari got the prize for being the Best Cadet. The CATC held at Paschim Vihar was attended by 8 cadets under the leadership of CPL Payal. In this Camp, our cadets won the 1<sup>st</sup> prize in group dance, group song, tug-of-war and throwball. The CATC held at Hari Nagar was attended by 12 cadets under the leadership of JUO Caroline Kasar who won the Gold Medal for best contribution in leadership. The CATC of Navy wing held at Bakkargarh was attended by 19 cadets under the leadership of CPL Hansa. In this camp, our cadets stood 1<sup>st</sup> in throw-ball while CDT Neha Kaur won the Gold Medal for being the Best in Firing.

The NCC cadets of our college participated in different NCC Festivals organized by different colleges and won prizes everywhere. Our cadets emerged winners in drill competition as well as in solo song and stood 2<sup>nd</sup> in group dance at Miranda House; 1<sup>st</sup> in Drill at PGDAV College; 1<sup>st</sup> in group song at Gargi College; 1<sup>st</sup> in drill at Zakir Hussain College; 1<sup>st</sup> in NCC run and 2<sup>nd</sup> in drill at Kalindi College; 1<sup>st</sup> in Guard, Drill, group song, solo dance at ARSD College. SUO Neha Kumari was adjudged the best cadet at ARSD college and 2<sup>nd</sup> Best cadet at Zakir Hussain College.

Our cadets also presented a Fire-Fighting Demonstration in the opening ceremony of Antardhwani – the Annual cultural festival of DU before the Hon'ble Minister Mr. Kapil Sibal and other renowned guests.

Dr. Lata Sharma and Dr. Nirmaljeet Kaur Shahid coordinated the NCC cadets and visually challenged students of our college on Gyanodaya II – a special train by the University of Delhi to Udaipur in October 2012. In Gyanodaya – I, Dr. Geeta Sahare supervised the NCC cadets.

A.N.O Lt. Dr. Seema Kaushik was awarded the Director General commendation card 2011 for her outstanding contribution to the NCC. She also won a gold medal in 4x400m. relay and 2 Bronze medals in 800 m. as well as 1500 m. race in the 17<sup>th</sup> Asian Masters Athletics meet held at Chinese Taipei (Taiwan) in November, 2012.

### **From the Field of Sports**

During the session 2012 – 13, Lakshmibai College participated in 24 sports and games viz athletics, Baseball, Basketball, Boxing, Chess, Cricket, Cross Country, Fencing, Gymnastics, Handball, Judo, Kabaddi, Kho – Kho, Netball, Power-Lifting, Shooting, Softball, Swimming, Taekwondo, Table-Tennis, Volleyball, Wrestling, Weightlifting and Yoga competitions at various levels and performed remarkably well throughout the year. On the basis of over-all performance in inter-College tournaments, our college emerged as overall second in the University of Delhi. Our college missed the 1<sup>st</sup> position by just one point. The achievements are listed below:

## **Open International**

The relay team of LBC comprising of Ritu, Sandhya and Sandhya Saini won the second position in the Airtel Marathon Inter Collegiate Challenge. Ritu Dhruv attended India Camp in Cricket.

## **National**

Out of the 57 representations at National/ All India Level, Gold Medals (7) were won by Reshma Parveen , Jyoti and Neha Kashyap in All India Shooting Ball; Silver Medals (11) were won by Nosaba Khatoon in Kabaddi; Surbhi Jain, Rekha Rani, Meenakshi, Sajina and Sadaf in Baseball; Rajni and Shikha in Yoga; Jyoti and Neha Kashyap in Shooting Ball; Mohini in Sepak Takraw; and Bronze Medals (5) were won by Ritu in Salwan Marathon; Barkha in Kho-Kho; and Indu Bhatt, Indu and Jyoti in Shooting Ball.

Our students represented Delhi State at different levels such as Sr. National /Jr. National /Women National/ All India Championships, including Neha Sonia Dhankhar and Anita Singh in Athletics; Rekha Rani, Surbhi Jain, Sajina, Meenakshi and Sadaf in Baseball; Chanchal Lata and Ritu Dhruv in Cricket; Ritu in cross country and Mawana marathon; Jyoti Shukla and Nosaba Khatoon in Fencing; Preeti Tyagi, Chandni and Nosaba in Kabaddi; Barkha in Kho-kho; Bhawna Jain in netball; Rekha Rani, Surbhi Jain, Sajina and Meenakshi in softball; Mohini in Sepak Takraw; Neel Kamal, Lalita Gautam, Prabhdeep Kaur Monika and Anisa in Shooting ball; Meenakshi Panwar, Reenu Chaudhary, Neelkamal, Lalita Gautam and Manju in Volleyball. Ritu Dhruv played in Senior Challenger Cup, East Zone, Sr. National and captained the under 19 years team in Cricket.

## **All India Inter- University**

Out of 28 students of our college who represented Delhi University in All India Inter – University Competitions in different sports, Preeti Dubey, Surbhi Jain, Sajina and Meenakshi stood 1<sup>st</sup> in Baseball (4); while Chanchal Lata, Meenakshi, Monica and Rekha Rani stood 3<sup>rd</sup> in softball (4).

Those who participated in All India Inter University competitions include Neha and Sonia Dhakhar in Athletics (2); Harshika Chauhan, Bharti, Deepika and Sushma in Boxing(4); Ritu in Cross-Country (1); Jyoti Shukla, Prema, Shruti Tomar and Siddak in Fencing (4); Sonika in Gymnastics (1); Sushma in Judo (1); Mohini, Nagma Bano & Sakshi in Kho-Kho (3); Savita in Weight-Lifting (1); Sulekha & Akanksha in Wrestling (2); and Priyanka Yadav in Yoga (1).

## **North Zone Inter-University**

Mohini, Nagma Bano and Sakshi secured 3<sup>rd</sup> position in the Inter-University Kho-Kho Championship; while 14 others represented Delhi University including Chanchal Lata, Surbhi Jain & Dhanshree in Cricket (3); Preeti Tyagi, Chandni, Anu Tyagi, Rajesh & Nisha in Kabaddi (5); and Meenakshi Panwar, Reenu Chaudhary, Manju, Shikha Dhanda, Deepika & Neelkamal in Volleyball (6).



## **North Zone/ Inter SAI**

Vipul Gupta & Ruchika secured 3<sup>rd</sup> position in North zone softball Tournament; while Mohini stood 3<sup>rd</sup> in Inter-SAI Sepak Takraw Competition.

## **Inter – College**

In Inter-College competitions, Lakshmibai College stood overall 2<sup>nd</sup> with 44 points trailing behind JMC which secured 45 points. Our college emerged Champions in Cricket, Softball, Volleyball, Power – Lifting, Weight Lifting & Yoga; stood second in Boxing, Kabadi & Baseball; third in Athletics & Wrestling; and remained at 4<sup>th</sup> in Cross Country kho – kho & Judo.

Individually, we won a total of forty four (44) medals, including eighteen gold medals (four in Athletics- Neha in 100m; Neha in 200m, Sonia Dhankar in Shotput and Ritu in 10,000m.; four in Boxing Harshika, Deepika, Bharti and Shsuma; four in Power lifting – Sandhya Saini, Neha, Savita & Sushma; Three in Weight-Lifting- Sandhya Saini, Savita & Sonia Dhankar; two in Wrestling- Sulekha & Akanksha; and one in Judo – Sushma); eleven silver medals ( four in Atheltics – Sonia Dhankhar in Discus Throw, Ritu in 5000m. Savita in Triple Jump; Anita Singh in 5km. Walk; four in Boxing- Radhika Shankar, Indu Bhatt, Anshu and Akanksha; one in Power-Lifting- Sonia Dhankar; one in Weight-Lifting- Neha; and one in Wrestling- Babita); and fifteen Bronze medals (three in Athletics-Sandhya Saini in Triple Jump; Sandhya in Half Marathon; Neha, Sandhya Saini, Ritu & Sandhya in 4x400m. Relay; three in Judo – Nasima, Bharti and Akanksha; three in Taekwondo- Prema, Siddak & Deepika; two in Boxing – Ruchi & sheetal; two in wrestling – Bharti & Jyoti Shukla; one in Cross Country – Ritu; and one in Weight Lifting – Rinki Rajora.

## **Delhi State**

In Delhi State Competitions, we stood 3<sup>rd</sup> in Kabaddi as well as in Fencing. In women's festival, our college Volleyball team emerged as winners, while our Kabaddi team bagged the 2<sup>nd</sup> position and Athletics team stood 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Individually we won a total of 37 medals including ten gold medals (Bharti & Radhika in Boxing; Jyoti Shukla in Fencing; Sushma in Judo, Akanksha in wrestling; Rajni, Umeshwari, Meenakshi, Rajani and Jyoti Devi in Yoga; fifteen silver medals (Bharti, Ritu and Bharti in Athletics, Harshika, Bharti, Harshika Chauhan and Indu Bhatt in boxing sushma in Judo; Shruti in Fencing; Meenakshi, Vandana Sharma, Shikha, Tania, Jyoti Devi and Jyoti in yoga); and twelve Bronze medals (Sandhya and Sandhya Saini in Athletics; Nosaba & Neha Kandpal in Fencing; Anshu in boxing; Shikha, Jyotsna, Tania, Priyanka Yadav, Shikha and Geeta in Yoga).

## **Open Tournaments**

Our college teams participated in various open tournaments at All India, Delhi state and Inter-College level.

Our Volleyball team emerged as the champion in Bharti Cup, Miranda House Invitational Inter College, JMC tournament; stood 2<sup>nd</sup> in YMCA, Rohini and IGIPES; and 3<sup>rd</sup> at Nawada; Cricket team won

the 2<sup>nd</sup> position in Bharti cup; Yoga team stood 1<sup>st</sup> at IGIPESS; and Taekwondo team stood 2<sup>nd</sup> in Winter Cup at Naraina.

In different Delhi state level tournaments, we won a total of 12 medals including three gold (Ritu in Cross Country at IP College ; Harshika Chauhan & Bharti in Boxing at Baba Gang Nath;) three silver (Ritu in cross country at SRCC; Vipul in Taekwondo at Naraina; Rajni in Yoga at IGIPESS); and six bronze medals (Ritu in open cross country; Vipul, Jyoti & Jyoti shukla in Taekwondo at Naraina; Tania in Yoga at IGIPESS; and Radhika Shankar in Boxing).

The Department of Physical Education successfully organized the DU Inter-college Baseball tournament for women.

### **Status of Automation of Accounting Procedures and Student Information System**

The process of automation in these spheres is in full swing. Manual work registers have been completely replaced by computerized information in the Accounts and Students Information Reports. Programmed Software is ORCALE 10 G/11G/Windows 2000 Server edition based. Pay/pension Registers, Pay/Pension Slips/ Deduction Statements, Annual Income Statements, Tax Calculation Sheets, Form 16, Cheque Printing (all categories), Bank Lists for salary/ Pension Disbursement, Cashier's Cash Book/ Imprest Register, Balance Sheet Schedules and Miscellaneous Reports are automatically generated with Initial Data Entry on Programmed Software. The Daily Voucher Entry System has been in operation for the past three to four years.

Students registers and Mark sheets have also been generated through software based programmes. All categories of certificates (Character, Migration, Bonafide and College Leaving Certificate) issued to students will be generated through programmed software w.e.f. this year. Students' Attendance Records and Reports will be generated through programmed software w.e.f. 2011-2012.

Another added feature is that three differently abled students (VH) have cleared the CCC exam conducted by Department of Electronic in 2012.

Wi Fi connectivity has been provided to the college by Delhi University in all the main wings of the College w.e.f. 2011-12.

### **AFFIRMATIVE ACTION ON RESERVATION, ENABLING UNIT FOR DIFFERENTLY ABLED AND EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL.**

Guidance and counseling were provided to SC, ST and OBC and Disabled Students and parents seeking admission to various courses in the college.
